

MEDICAL PROGRAMS



Certified Nursing Assistant

Semester Program | Offered in Spring & Fall

CNAs help provide basic care for patients in hospitals and residents of long-term care facilities, such as nursing homes. Classroom instruction and clinical training include resident care skills, vital signs, nutrition, emergency procedures and rehabilitation.

Emergency Medical Technician

Duration Varies | Offered in Spring, Summer, Fall

EMTs care for the sick or injured in emergency medical settings. They respond to emergency calls, perform medical services and transport patients to medical facilities. Offered as a semester class or five-week accelerated class.

Electrocardiograph Technician

Semester Program | Offered in Spring & Fall

ECG Technicians are employed in doctors' offices, clinics and hospitals. They provide critical info to physicians about patients' heart health by preparing patients for procedures, operating machines, recording, measuring heart rates and rhythms including arrhythmia (irregular heartbeat).

Home Health Aide

8-Week Program | Offered in Summer

Home Health Aides help people with disabilities, chronic illness, or cognitive impairment with activities of daily living. They often help older adults who need assistance. Must be a licensed Certified Nursing Assistant to enroll.

Medical Assistant

Medical assistants complete administrative and clinical tasks in the offices of physicians, hospitals, and other healthcare facilities. Their duties vary with the location, specialty, and size of the practice. Course includes both front office and back office training.

Semester Program | Offered in Spring & Fall

Medical Terminology

Self-Paced Online Course; Begin Any Time

This course teaches the language of medicine applicable to all health care occupations, including basic medical word roots, combining forms, prefixes, suffixes, and abbreviations. It offers students a working knowledge of terms used in all of our medical programs.

Pharmacy Technician

Semester Program | Offered in Spring & Fall

Pharmacy Technicians help pharmacists dispense prescription medication to customers or health professionals. This class meets State Board requirements for Registered Pharmacy Technician Licensure. Includes externship at local pharmacies.

Phlebotomist

Semester Program | Offered in Spring & Fall

Phlebotomists collect blood samples & units for laboratory tests, transfusions, donations, or research. Students must successfully complete the classroom portion to be permitted to attend the Advanced Phlebotomy portion of the program, then proceed to a one-week unpaid externship.

Respiratory Therapist

Associates Degree / Bachelors Degree Program Applications Due in Spring

Respiratory Therapists care for patients who have trouble breathing. Their patients range from premature infants to elderly patients. They also provide emergency care to patients suffering from heart attacks, drowning, or shock. This program includes both classroom and clinical training.

Surgical Technologist

Associates Degree / Bachelors Degree Program Applications Due in Spring

Surgical Technologists assist in surgical operations. They prep operating rooms, arrange equipment, and help doctors during surgeries. This program includes both classroom and clinical training intended to prepare students to sit for to sit for NBSTSA's CST exam.
