

Viewpoint School, founded in 1961, is an independent, non-profit, coeducational college preparatory day school with an enrollment of 1,200 students in Transitional Kindergarten through Twelfth Grade and 500 students in the high school. Students come from 90 zip codes around Los Angeles, and the parents represent 75 countries. Nearly 100% of graduates attend four-year colleges nationwide and around the world.

GRADING SYSTEM

- Viewpoint School does not rank.
- Students are required to enroll in five academic classes per semester in Ninth and Tenth Grades, and a minimum of four academic classes and one elective each semester in Eleventh and Twelfth Grades.
- Viewpoint reports both weighted and unweighted GPAs, on a 4.0 scale, for work completed at Viewpoint only.
- One point is added to the cumulative weighted GPA for each Honors, AP, and VAS course.

VIEWPOINT ADVANCED STUDIES - VAS

Last year, a new designation on the transcript, VAS, refers to post-AP classes that represent the most advanced classes in those subject areas. VAS courses require successful completion of the associated AP courses.
