

### HIGH SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

#### How can you prepare for success in High School? Start now!

- Stay ENGAGED in your school work with NO MISSING ASSIGNMENTS! Most high school teachers will not except late work (unless medically absent) OR they will reduce points if turned in late. This can have a BIG impact on your grade!
- STUDY for <u>all</u> of your classes, even before a test is announced! This means staying on top of reading assignments, reviewing class notes and asking clarifying questions regularly. Test grades are often heavily weighted, especially in Math! Remember that HOMEWORK helps you study and prepare.
- COMMUNICATE with your teachers! Teachers are here to help BUT they don't know what you don't share. Be an ADVOCATE for yourself! This may take your time during break, lunch or after school but it will help you build solid relationships with staff that can help support your high school journey.



- Class takes into account the ways our multiple identities intersect with relationships of power in society.







Placement in a class is not guaranteed; all requests submitted by the due date have an equal opportunity for class enrollment as space permits once current HS students are enrolled.
