You will be taking your AP Exam(s) in May. You can find your exam schedule by logging into your College Board AP account. Please check it carefully for accuracy. If you have any questions, please contact us immediately.

- **AP Students who have afternoon (11:30) exams will have “A” lunch on the day of their exam.**
- **Students with afternoon exams will need make alternate transportation arrangements or ride the late bus home**
- **Students who are testing AM & PM on same day must bring their own lunch. Depending on what time the AM exam ends, you may have to eat your lunch quickly before the PM exam begins.**
- **Students who are scheduled for an AP exam and EOC at the same time will take their AP exam during scheduled time and will make up their EOC exam. This will be scheduled for you.**
- **You are required to arrive on time. Late arrivals will NOT be allowed to test. Students may not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam.**
- **If you play a sport or have a job, it is your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation. Afternoon exams will go past the end of the school day. Please make arrangements for all of these obligations accordingly.**

Bring the following items to the exam room:

- Identification: current driver’s license, current school ID, or current passport. **You must provide proper ID in order to test.** Go to the attendance office prior to testing if you need identification assistance.
- **Two sharpened No. 2 pencils** with erasers, for all responses on your multiple-choice answer sheet
- **Two pens** with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- **Span. Lang./French Lang./Music Theory students MUST BRING YOUR CHROMEBOOK FULLY CHARGED AND YOUR POWER CHARGER CORD.**
- **Up to two approved calculators** with the necessary capabilities if you’re taking **the AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exams.** Visit apstudents.org/courses to find the calculator policy for your subject. *For a list of approved graphing calculators, visit apstudents.org/calculators.*
- A ruler or straightedge only if you’re taking an **AP Physics Exam.** Protractors are not allowed.
- Snacks to keep at the front of the room.
- Your social security number for identification purposes for AP score reports (optional).
- A watch without an alarm (optional)

DO NOT bring the following to the exam room:

- Cell phones, smart phones, smartwatches, laptops, tablet computers, portable listening or recording devices such as MP3 players and iPods, cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet or any other electronic or communication devices. If any of these items are brought into the testing room they will be collected prior to testing. EXCEPTION: Language & Music Theory Students need their Chromebooks!
- Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, colored pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, or notes.
- Rulers and straightedges (except as noted above)
- Scratch paper
- Calculators (except as noted above)
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- Clothing with subject-related information.

REMEMBER:

Get a good night's rest before your exam and eat a nutritious breakfast. You are allowed to bring a snack and beverage for your 10-minute break. It is advisable to bring a sweater in case the room temperature is below your comfort level.

You are required to abide by the policies of College Board and Jersey Village High School during the exam. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score. **If you decide not to take an exam, please inform us as soon as possible prior to the test administration.** No refunds will be issued, and you will be charged if you had a Free/Reduced lunch waiver.

Get Your Scores

[Sign in with your College Board account](#). Make sure it's the same account that you used to register and enroll in your AP class sections. If you've forgotten your username or password, recover them. Visit [Forgot Username?](#) to have your username sent to the email address used to set up your account. If you know your username but not your password, go to [Forgot Password?](#) Make sure Collegeboard has your current email address. If you've changed your email address, update it in your account.

Don't create a new account if you already have one. Duplicate accounts can cause delays in getting your AP scores. Sign in with the same account you used to register and enroll in AP class sections. Use your free score send by June 20.

You can send your scores for free to one recipient every year that you take AP Exams. To use your free score send, sign in to My AP, go to My AP Profile, select the Score Send tab and choose the college, university, or scholarship organization that you want to receive your score report. Make sure to take advantage of your 2023 free score send before the June 20 deadline.

Sending AP Scores

After you take an AP Exam, Collegeboard will send your score report to the college or university that you designated in My AP. Your score report is cumulative and includes scores for all the AP Exams you have ever taken, unless you requested that one or more scores be withheld from a college or canceled. When you go online you will be able to see your entire score report and score-send history. If you wish to send additional score reports to colleges, universities, and scholarship programs you can do so online for a fee. You can send scores online anytime for a fee.

You can order as many score reports as you need online after scores are released. If you're not able to get online to send your scores, you can send them by mail or fax.

You should check college deadlines.

If you're a senior entering college in the fall, check your college's deadline for getting AP scores. We encourage you to send scores as soon as possible to make sure they're received in time.
