## **Background**

- **Cy-Fair Educational Foundation (“CFEF”)** founded in 1970 by Cy-Fair business & community leaders as 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization
- **CFEF Board consists of approximately 62 volunteer Board trustees committed to assisting students with post high school educational pursuits**
- **Vision - Provide financial assistance to Cy-Fair Independent School District (“CFISD”) students wanting to attend college**
- **Mission - Singularly committed to fundraising & scholarships for students from CFISD**
- **Completely aligned with CFISD due to our financial assistance awarded ONLY to CFISD students**



## **CFEF Impact**

- **Celebrating our 52nd year - Awards total over \$11 Million to 2,300+ students**
- **Donated approximately \$3.6 million for CFISD staff development grants through the Salute to the Stars Event (which started in 1998)**

- December 6, 2022 – Online application should be available on CFEF website
- January 27, 2023 – Anticipated deadline for online application for certain CFEF awards
- April 10, 2023 – Anticipated date for online application for CFEF Schroeder application on website
  - Requires Lone Star College attendance
- May 13, 2023 - Deadline for online application for Edwin Schroeder endowment awards
  - Awarded to CFISD senior students attending Lone Star College
  - Typically 40-50 scholarships - \$2,000 awards (\$75,000 annual cap)

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

# Need Extra/Makeup Credits?

**Must apply with Counselor for approval**

**Digital Credit Recovery:** Taken on campus in a class period using Edgenuity program - available for some failed courses.

**Credit-by-Exam:** Taken at the Brautigam Center (formerly Windfern High School) Must make an 80+ for original credit.

**Night/Weekend School:** Houston Community College limited original credit and recovery credit offerings.

**Correspondence: TTUISD or UT High School**

May take up to 2 credits by correspondence. Must be completed by Dec. 1 of the senior year due to graduation ranking

# Absences

- Student must be in attendance 90% of the days for the semester or credit for the course is lost due to excessive absences.
- No more than 8 absences in 1<sup>st</sup> semester and no more than 10 in 2<sup>nd</sup> semester
- **Assistant Principal (AP)** must approve all make up hours.

# Final Exam Exemptions

- Must have an 75+ semester average, no more than 5 absences, no more than 3 tardies
- Fees, suspension, alternative discipline placements, and U in conduct cause immediate loss of exemptions

**Junior exemptions: Fall =3 & Spring=3**

**Seniors exemptions: Fall = 4 & Spring = 7**

- **have more K, AP or DC courses on transcript than L-level courses**
- **GPA 6.0 or higher**

**Restrictions?**

**Students may Pass/Fail up to a total of 2.0 credits.**

# Testing



- **STAAR (EOC)** - for graduation
- **SAT or ACT** - for college admission
- **ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)** - measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. January 10, 2023.
- **AP Testing (Advanced Placement)** - first two weeks in May, can earn college credit if accepted by university
- **TSIA 2 (Texas Success Initiative)** - must be taken prior to registration to a Texas college if not exempt

*Junior or Community Colleges have open admissions policies and do not require SAT or ACT tests but do require the TSI if not exempt.*




