

How much will it cost?


Thanks to the Tennessee Dual Enrollment Grant (DEG) and reduced tuition costs for Chattanooga State Community College Early College students, taking college courses while in high school has never been more affordable! Taking Dual Enrollment classes is a smart way to save time and money as students begin the journey toward their college degree and, ultimately, the career of their dreams!

Dual Enrollment Grant (DEG) and Out of Pocket Costs

- ▶ The DEG is available for any high school junior or senior with legal residence in the state of Tennessee.
- ▶ In order to continue using the DEG, students must maintain a college GPA of 2.75.
- ▶ **Enhanced Grant:** The DEG only pays for one course per semester unless a student is eligible for the Enhanced Grant. The Enhanced Grant will allow students to use DEG funding for up to 3 classes in one semester. In order to qualify for Enhanced Grant, students must have a 3.0 GPA or a 21 ACT score. Homeschool students must have a 21 ACT to qualify for Enhanced Grant.
- ▶ **If you qualify for Enhanced Grant, but don't want to use it, contact our office.**

BOOK COST

- Books can range from \$50 - \$200
 - Book cost is not covered by the Dual Enrollment Grant (DEG)

Types of Courses Offered at Chatt State

Online - Meets anytime, no scheduled zoom, or no in-person class

Virtual - Online class with scheduled meetings such as zoom

In-person - Meets with a professor in-person at scheduled times. This is how the Comp I class will be taught with a Chatt State professor here on SCHS Campus.

- Some classes are moving to 7 weeks instead of the traditional 13-14 week in length. This means more work to complete the course in a shorter amount of time.

If your college class is in the middle of your schedule, you CAN'T leave in the middle of the day and return to SCHS!

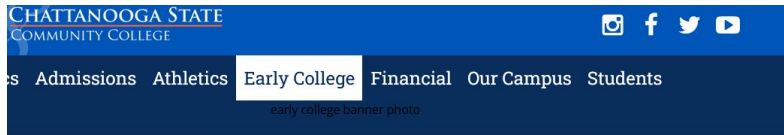


Helpful Tips about College Classes and Skyward:

- ★ Once enrolled in the college class, your high school Skyward schedule will show your college class. The teacher name in Skyward may not reflect your actual professor's name.
- ★ Dual Enrollment classes get 4 honor points added to the final high school grade.

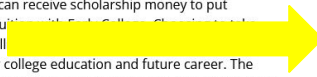
