## PROGRAMME OF STUDY

We have chosen the OCR A-Level qualification as we feel the breadth of the units offers a stimulating and varied course of study, offering an enjoyable learning experience that prepares you for university.

The assessment is predominately essay based and you'll look at areas on Britain, a world study and a coursework which is assessed on a subject of your choosing, therefore it is essential to be reading around that subject in your own time. You'll also be given a specific reading and viewing pack for each section of the course.

Outside of the classroom there are a number of historical trips within the UK and abroad. There is also the opportunity to become a History Prefect, Contribute to HistSoc, the History Society and magazine, and join one of the many societies the school has to offer and act as a mentor to younger students in the school.

## ASSESSMENT

- Four units, each making up different weighted percentages of the qualification.
- A sources based investigation on British History worth 25%
- An essay based paper on a non-British area of History worth 15%
- An essay based study over a substantial period of time, between two and four hundred years, worth 40%
- A coursework, which consists of one long essay which is chosen by students and researched with the support of staff.

## FUTURE PLANS

History is well regarded by universities and is a degree course with a strong pedigree in its own right. It is a popular degree choice for our leavers, but can also support a wide range of degrees such as Law, English, Economics and more.
