Founded in 1958 by conscientious parents, Harbor Country Day School provides a dynamic, academically enriching independent day school experience for PK3 students through grade eight.

Harbor's beautiful, 11-acre campus is located on Long Island's north shore, nestled in the quiet village of Head of the Harbor. With its legacy of blending tradition with innovation, Harbor nurtures happy, confident students who are encouraged to strive for excellence, embrace their natural curiosity, and interact respectfully with others. Our approach is to educate the whole student in an environment where every facet of a child's learning experience is enriched with proven, differentiated-instruction techniques incorporating 21st century skills. Traditional methods of teaching are enhanced with leading-edge strategies and curricula to inspire the children, cultivate their talents, and empower each to achieve at the highest possible level.

Harbor offers a warm and supportive environment in which children thrive under the guidance and personal attention of skilled and dedicated faculty and members of the administration. Harbor provides an educational experience rich in both academics and life lessons. Harbor Country Day School's goal is to give students an experience, not just in academics, but also in life, one that builds character and leadership. Our graduates go on to succeed in their secondary and college education, careers, and life. Harbor Country Day School is chartered by the New York State Board of Regents and is accredited by, and a member of, the New York State Association of Independent Schools (NYSAIS). From humble beginnings...

In 1957, several families from St. James and surrounding communities gathered to discuss the importance of education and an alternative to the public school system. Collectively, the families decided to purchase the famed Alice Throckmorton McLean estate on Three Sisters Road in Head of the Harbor, and to turn the mansion into a small, independent, nonprofit school. One year later, they opened Harbor Country Day School.

Within three years, the original student body of 38 had grown to 100 students and the defining culture of the school had clearly taken shape. Now, 60 years later, that child-centered, compassionate culture continues to drive the curriculum at Harbor.

We believe in and celebrate the inherent goodness of children, providing the time, space, and resources for them to be young while constantly evaluating what, how, and why we teach. We strive to create an academically challenging and supportive school environment where children are resourceful and creative problem-solvers who know how to work well with others. Goal 1: Strengthen our Financial Foundation


Address key areas of our financial foundation: endowment, faculty salaries and benefits, tuition assistance, programmatic needs, and building and grounds

Grow the school's endowment by creating a multi-faceted Tulip Knoll Endowment, and design a multi-year budget to meet the expanding needs of our school program and faculty


Bolster giving to the Harbor Fund

Goal 2: Support and Empower Faculty and Staff



Recruit, hire, and retain teachers who love working with children, are experts in their fields, and are life-long learners themselves

Continue to improve and enhance the compensation and benefit package to draw and keep the best teachers in their fields here at Harbor

Maintain a professional development program, internally and externally, that supports the faculty and staff, as it stays current with best practices that are aligned with state-of-the-art educational thought, and one that includes a faculty evaluation program

Institute an enhanced program to guide parents and students through the secondary school placement process



Goal 3: Foster an Innovative Educational Program

- ☀️ Promote an academic program that teaches traditional academic skills in an innovative setting, where students are collaborative and creative, as well as independent and resourceful learners
- ☀️ Provide the necessary resources for teachers to create dynamic, experiential, and engaging classrooms
- ☀️ Develop a strategic plan for our technology curriculum that is integrated throughout the school and teaches current programmatic offerings

- ☀️ Advance a pedagogical philosophy that promotes student-centered, hands-on, project-based learning
- ☀️ Implement a cross-curricular method of teaching using a STEAM philosophy that combines science, technology, engineering, the arts, and mathematics through student-centered, inquiry-based projects that develop real-world skills
- ☀️ Analyze regional demographics and opportunities for international students to assess the best composition for Harbor



Goal 4: Modernize our Campus and Physical Plant

- ☀️ Ensure Harbor's campus supports its history, educational goals and mission
- ☀️ Build a state-of-the-art STEAM Center that will house new science labs, a MakerSpace studio, robotics equipment, a kiln room, and the school library
- ☀️ Build an efficient parking and drop-off/pick-up area
- ☀️ Modernize the main building, while maintaining its historical warmth and charm
- ☀️ Update playing fields to align with Harbor's physical education program

🌿 Broadcast the strengths and successes of our program as a premier independent, elementary day school on Long Island



🌿 Publicize and communicate the advantages of Harbor's broad program through our website, social media, and local media outlets
