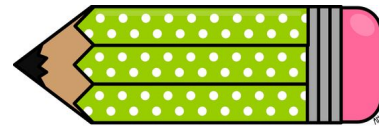

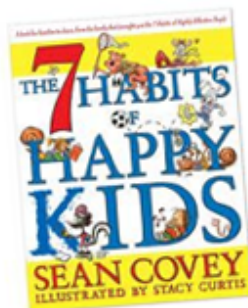


SHARON LEADERSHIP

- I am always learning how to become a better person.



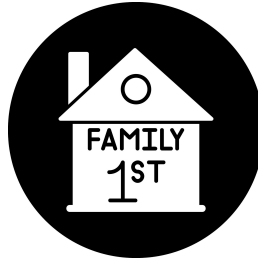
FAMILY FIRST NIGHT

March 18

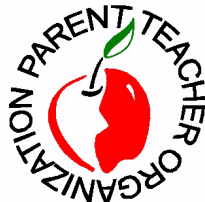
The Highland Schools is pleased to offer the 4th Annual "Family First" Night on Monday, March 18.

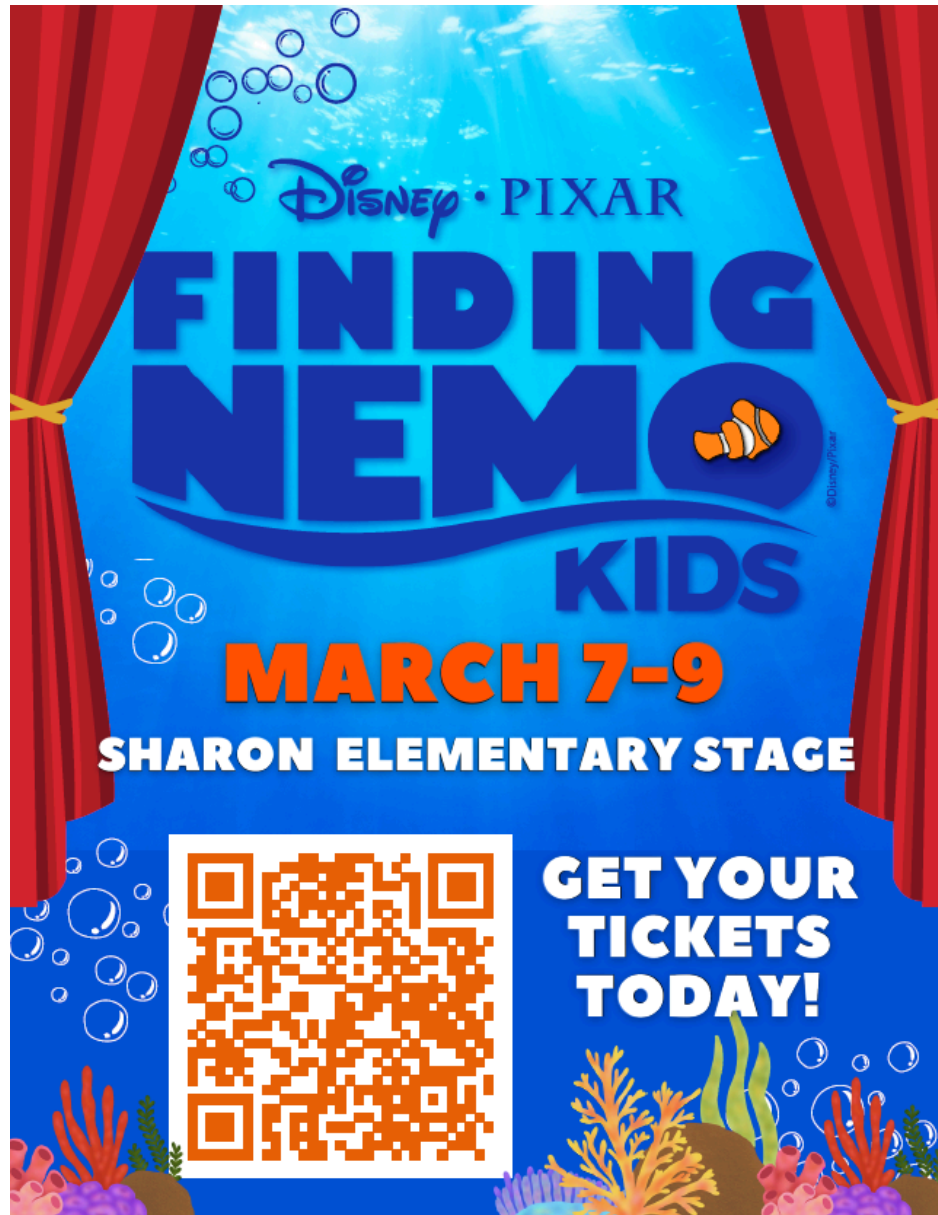
