Non-Digital Exam

The online registration form for a PreACT is now open.

Students interested in taking this practice exam are asked to report to **Woodmere Middle School** no later than 7:45 a.m., where classroom assignments will be posted. Students must have two #2 pencils, a graphing calculator, and acceptable photo ID.

Snacks must be packed in clear zip-lock bags with name clearly labeled. Labels must be removed from all water bottles. Students must bring proper photo ID and their Admission Ticket.

Acceptable Photo ID documents include:

- Valid driver's license or driver's permit
- U.S. Passport
- Hewlett High School ID Card

For students who cannot test on Saturday, we are offering the exam again on **Sunday**, **December 3rd.** Please indicate this request on the form.

Check for eligibility in the PPS Office. If you qualify, please make an appointment ASAP with Mrs. Bavaro for an interview and to obtain the guidelines for your selected college. It is important to view these guidelines as each college handles things differently. While we may have your SAT or ACTs, teacher letters, and transcript on file, you must electronically submit your application, print it, and submit copy into PPS by material due date!

SAT vs. ACT: Learn the Differences

College Admissions Reminders:

- 1. Student must be **CLEAR** with their recommending teachers about their college application deadlines. Students are to inquire with the teacher if any additional information is needed in this process.
- 2. It is the student's responsibility to create portal accounts on each applied college. This is where students check their **application status** for missing documents. Wait approximately one/two weeks for documents to upload on status screen from the time of Naviance submission.
- 3. Students must send their ACT and/or SAT from their online accounts. PPS does not send scores.
- 4. Transcript Release Requests for colleges with January 2023 deadline must be submitted to PPS no later than December 9th.
- 5. Be mindful of what you post on your social networking sites. <u>Click here</u> to read more!
- 6. Follow up with your emails! Colleges may request additional information such as your 1st quarter grades or submission of the CSS Profile (see below).
- 7. Students who wish to send 1st quarter grades must submit request form. <u>Click here</u> to download.
- **8.** Keep up your grades the entire year! Admission to every college is contingent on successful high school completion! Your **final GPA** must be similar to the GPA at acceptance time!
- 9. Communicate with your counselor and teachers if you apply to additional colleges!
- 10. Check websites and/or call admissions office to learn method of releasing admissions decisions.

College Scholarships and Financial Aid:



Once the college applications have been submitted, students and parents should immediately turn their attention to researching scholarships. There is a great deal of scholarship money available for students, but it does require research!

CSSProfile is required by many **private colleges**. <u>Click here</u> to view participating colleges.

Each month, the PPS Newsletter will post the most recent scholarship information delivered to our office.

It is important to be knowledgeable of the different scholarship programs available to high school students:

• **Need Based Scholarships:** Money awarded based on financial need; as demonstrated on the FAFSA.

Packages are mailed home in early spring of senior year after electronic submission of FAFSA form.

- Merit Scholarships: Money awarded based upon academic achievement during high school and standardized test scores. Generally, no additional work is required and notification comes with (or shortly after) admissions offer.
- **College Based Scholarships:** Money awarded by a specific college. Many competitive colleges award money based on additional requirements that are fulfilled on separate scholarship applications.
- **General College Scholarships:** Many organizations offer scholarship money based upon a variety of factors. Each scholarship will require a separate application with varying degrees of additional work.
