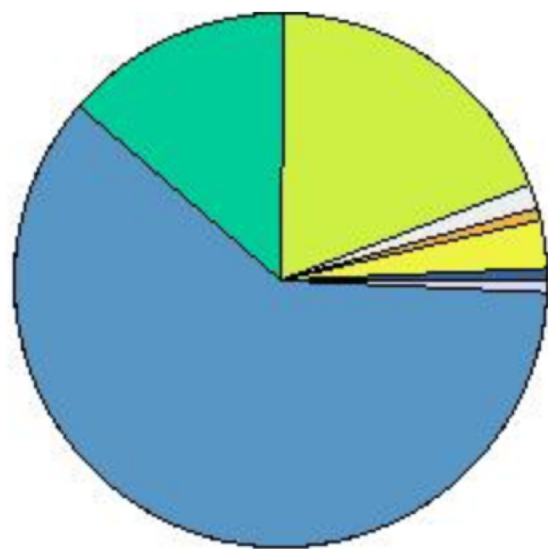
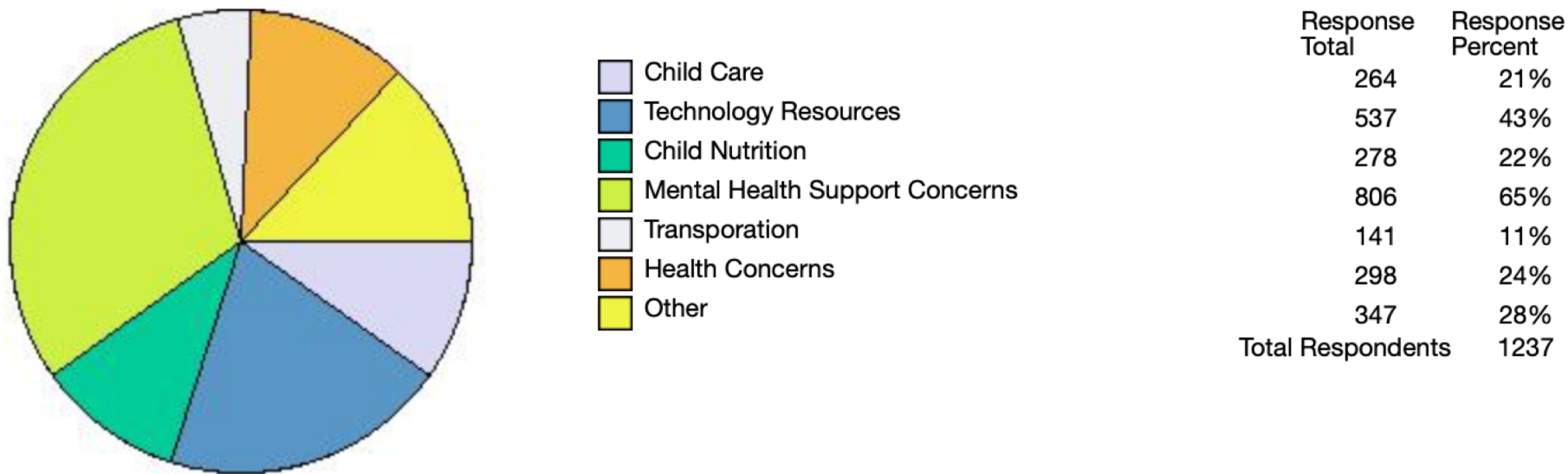

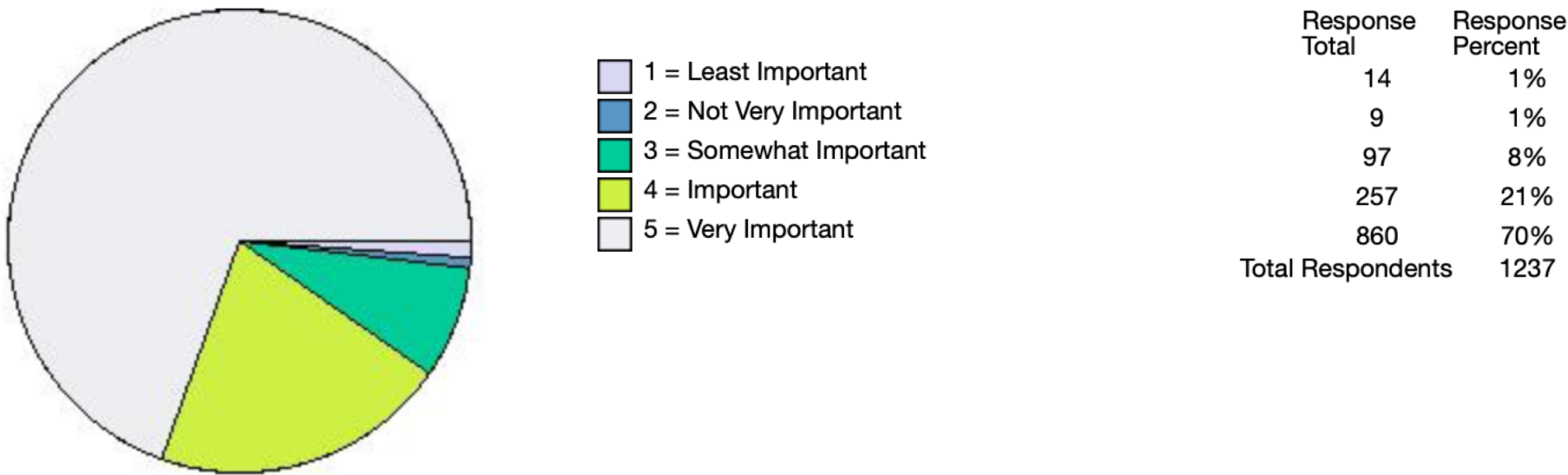

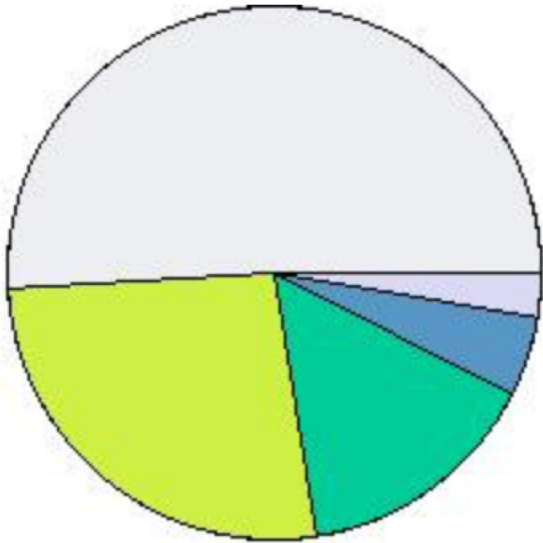

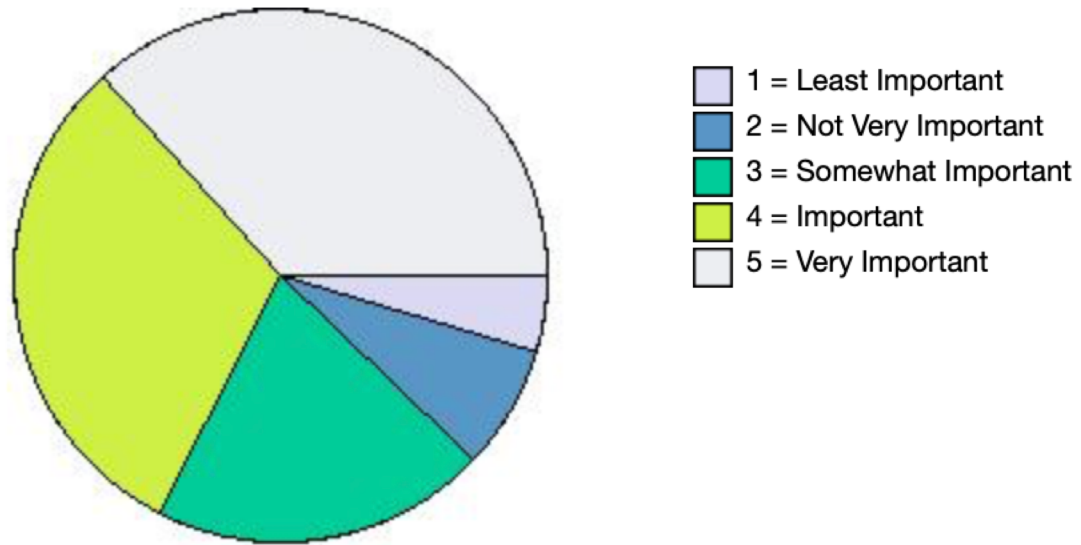
8. Mental health interventions and support services for students.
