What Is Dual Credit?

The Dual Credit program is a partnership between JJC and area high school and career centers. Junior and senior high school students earn both high school and college credit upon successful completion of Dual Credit courses.

Dual Credit Accreditation

JJC is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission. The HLC establishes guidelines to ensure academic integrity of Dual Credit programs at accredited institutions.

- Instructor Credentials

Instructors for Dual Credit courses are selected, employed and evaluated by the community college.

- Course Syllabus & Design

Dual Credit instructors syllabus and design are the the same as JJC instructors syllabus and design.

Dual Credit Student Responsibilities

Academic Honor Code

Students are expected to demonstrate integrity, honesty, and responsibility in completing their college level coursework.

Transferring

Accepting courses for transfer depends on the individual college or university. Students should contact their intended transfer institution directly to inquire about the transferability of their Dual Credit coursework.

Dual Credit Student Responsibilities

Withdrawals

If a student is not earning a “C” or better by the final drop date, it is time to consider a withdrawal. Failure to withdraw by the deadline may result in a failing grade on the student’s academic transcript.

Moving/Graduating Early

If a student moves or graduates early, the student must withdraw from the Dual Credit course. Failure to withdraw from the JJC course may result in a failing grade on the JJC transcript.

Dual Credit Academic Record

Dual Credit students begin their official college transcript with JJC. College credit is awarded immediately upon successful completion of each Dual Credit course. Students usually earn the same grade for both the high school course and the JJC course. Dual Credit grades will be part of the student's records throughout their college career.

Students enrolled in Dual Credit who do not earn a grade “C” or better will not be allowed to enroll in additional Dual Credit courses. These students are placed on Academic Caution.

FERPA & Parents

FERPA Guide for Parents of Dual Credit Students

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (sometimes referred to as FERPA) was designed to protect the privacy of educational records and to establish the rights of students to inspect and review their educational records.

Once a student turns eighteen, or attends school beyond secondary school, the rights of access to the student's records transfer to the student. **This includes students that are dually enrolled in high school and college.** This means that all academic information regarding your college student goes directly to the student unless the student has given specific, written permission to release that information to someone else. While parents naturally have an interest in their child's academic progress (and may even be paying for their education), they are not automatically granted access to their records.

Benefits of Dual Credit

Earn College Credit Prior to High School Graduation

Most Dual Credit courses are **transferable** and speed up the time to college degree completion.

Reduces Overall College Costs

JJC Dual Credit courses are offered to high school students at a reduced rate \$12 per credit hour, which is much more **affordable** than the cost of a college class offered at a traditional four-year university.

Student Access

Dual Credit students are considered JJC students, and therefore are granted access to JJC **resources and activities** on campus. Campus resources include free tutoring, college major and career planning, use of the JJC Library and 16 years and older with a signed waiver access to JJC Total Fitness Center.

Benefits of Dual Credit

Convenience

High School student can take courses as **part of the regular** school day.

Facilitates the Transition Between High School and College

Dual Credit courses help prepare students for the transition to college by engaging students in college-level work and **developing pathways** to degree attainment.

Enhances the Curriculum for High School Students

The addition of college coursework to high school curriculum **expands the options available** to high school students while adding college-level rigor.

Weighing the options

Dual Credit

- Earned college credit
- If students are below a “C” by final drop date, can withdrawal.
- Can help establish higher GPA and have a concrete grade for special admissions programs
- \$12 per credit hour at JJC
- Counts toward attempted credits for Financial Aid.

AP Exams

- Used for alternate credit and/or placement
- Must earn score of 3+ to earn credit
- May be a limited amount accepted (for JJC, it is 30 credits)
- Counted as a “C” grade for some special admissions programs at JJC
- Approx. minimum cost \$98 for 2024
- Counts toward attempted credits for Financial Aid.

Dual Credit Cost Savings

Reduces Overall College Costs

Did You Know:

- High school students can take dual credit classes even if they have never taken Honors or AP classes.
- Dual credit students have access to JJC's academic support services such as the Tutoring & Learning Center and the Library.
- Dual credit students do not have to take a special exam at the end of the course to earn college credit. Passing the quizzes and exams that students take as a part of their joint high school/dual credit class is all that is required to earn college credit.

Testing Sessions can be offered at the High School Campus for all Dual Credit Courses, Please check with your counselor for upcoming dates or visit JJC.edu/placement for hours and locations of JJC Testing Services.

- Students will need to have a JJC Dual Credit application on file prior to test date.
- It takes 24-72 business hours from the time a student completes the application until their MYJJC account is created
- Students will need a **physical photo ID to test-** HS, drivers license, passport
- Contact your counselor if you need to test for any Dual Credit course prerequisite.

- Students will need to have a JJC application on file prior to test date.
- It takes 24-72 business hours from the time a student completes the application until their MyJJC account is created
- Students will need a **physical photo ID to test-** HS, drivers license, passport
- Placement Testing is on a walk in basis
- Last test administered no later than one hour prior to closing.

College Board Accuplacer Reading & Writing Test

Accuplacer Exam, produced by College Board, is a computer-based, untimed test for reading and writing.

Students may attempt each Accuplacer test twice each semester if they have not begun an English course sequence. Students are eligible for a third testing attempt only after successful completion of Accuplacer remediation through JJC's Tutoring and Learning Center. College Board Accuplacer Geometry Test

Accuplacer Geometry exam, produced by College Board, is a computer-based, untimed test.

Can be taken 2 times in a 2 year period.

Students can borrow and use a scientific calculator during the Geometry test.

- Earning 60 or more points on Accuplacer Geometry test.
- Submitting to the Admissions Department a high school transcript showing completion of two semesters of geometry with a C or higher.
- MATH 119, 123, 124, 131, 138, and 142 require the geometry prerequisite

***Geometry scores never expire**

McGraw Hill Aleks Math Test

The ALEKS Exam, produced by McGraw Hill, is a computer-based, untimed math test.

ALEKS Math placement uses open-response questioning—not multiple choice.

The ALEKS test will provide an on-screen calculator when appropriate. Use of calculators not provided by ALEKS, is prohibited.

After taking the test for the first time ALEKS offers remediation modules students may access from home if they do not meet the required placement score. There is a 24 hour waiting period between each test attempt. A mandatory minimum of 3 hours must be completed in the ALEKS Prep and Learning modules before testing attempts 3, 4 and 5.

ALEKS remediation is a great way to boost SAT scores.

Scores are good for 24 months

To enroll in dual credit classes, you will need to fill out a dual credit application below.

How to Apply to be a JJC Dual Credit Student

Dual Credit Application

Please select the right term (semester/year), then enter your date of birth as ##/##/####. Enter your last name, then your first name.

Under "Educational Goals," choose "I only plan to complete one or several courses." Under "Reason for Attending JJC," choose "Other."

You are required to use your social security number to apply. This is the best way to identify you. It is especially important for processing and maintaining accurate educational records. Your social security number is restricted to internal college use. JJC cannot use your social security number to match your application with test scores, financial aid or maintenance of your academic record. **If you are an undocumented student and do not have a social security number, call (815) 280-2493 for an alternative number.**

Submit your application. 72 hours after application is submitted you will need to return to JJC.edu create after your new student account, JJC will send an email to the personal email address you provided in your application, containing your new JJC email address.

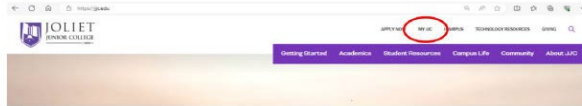
Once you have completed your new account set up, you will have access to your MY JJC portal, which contains your JJC email and billing statement.

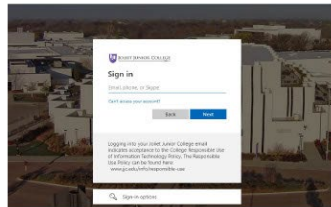

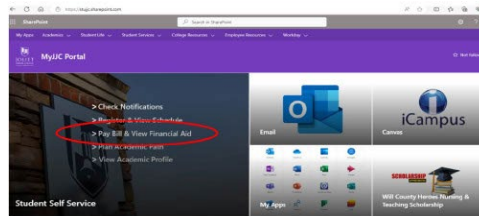
1. Go to jjc.edu and click on **MY JJC**.



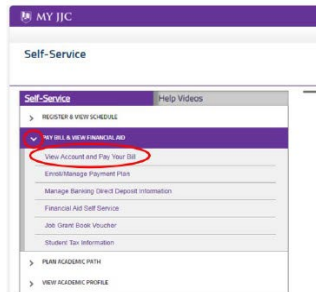
2. Sign in with your JJC email address and password. If you do not know this please see the **JJC Dual Credit Account Access Troubleshooting Guide** on page 3.



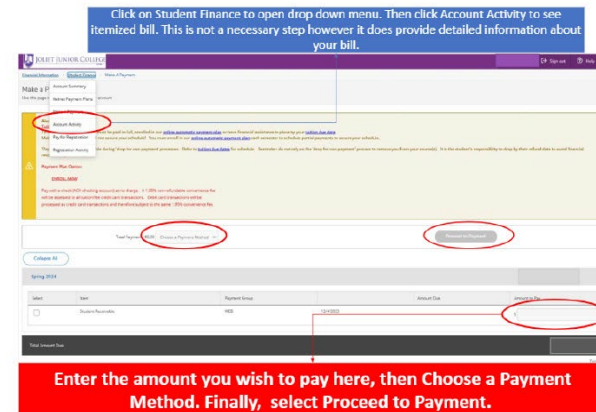
3. Once logged in, you will come to the page pictured below. Click on **Pay Bill & View Financial Aid**.

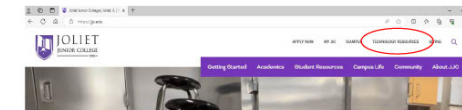


5. This will bring you to the following page. From this page, you can find details about your bill and make a payment.

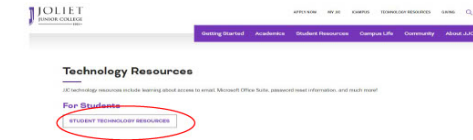

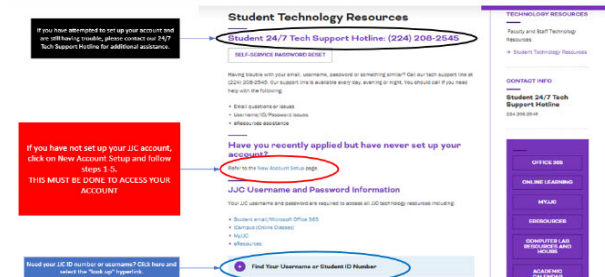
If you are trying to access your JJC account and are having difficulties, please go to jjc.edu and click on **TECHNOLOGY RESOURCES**.

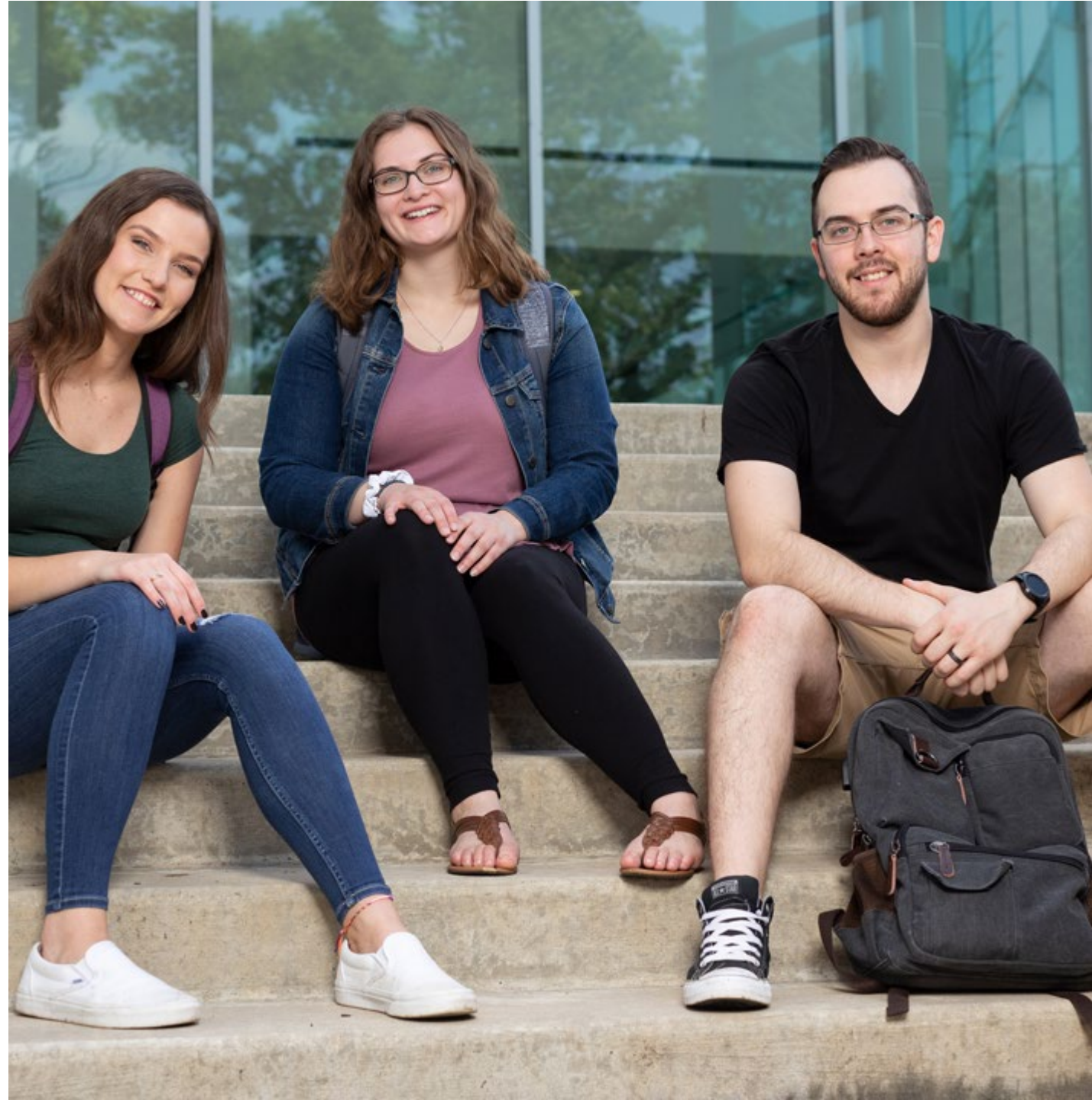
