Dear Parents:

This time of year we all start to count the days until the weather really starts to warm up. However, besides thinking about the weather, we are well into planning for our spring testing. Even though testing will not begin until April 11th, there are many things that need to occur in March for us to be ready for the start of our annual statewide testing for all juniors. Teachers and students have been working very hard to pre- pare for these important exams, and I am confident that the results this year will again prove that all this hard work was very worthwhile.

The MME is the total of all of the exams that make up the testing cycle. Each junior must take all three parts to have a complete MME score to meet the TSD assessment graduation requirement. The SAT is the anchor exam of the MME. The SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) is a standardized test widely used for college admissions in the United States. It was first introduced in 1926 and it has had several name changes throughout the years. In recent years some universities have eliminated the mandatory reporting of these scores. Our students have performed extraordinarily well on this assessment. Part two of the MME is the ACT WorkKeys and part three is the M-STEP test. The three parts together complete the MME for juniors. Additionally, our 9th and 10th graders will get a chance at a free practice test. On April 16th our 9th graders will take the PSAT 9 and 10th graders will take the PSAT 10 on April 11th

In the meantime, our testing team will be working very hard to register our students. If you have any further testing questions, feel free to contact Mrs. Brennan, <u>kbrennan@troy.kl2.mi.us</u>.

2024-2025 Scheduling

The course selection process for the 2024-2025 school year begins in February. Students will receive a planning guide and have the opportunity to receive guidance from teachers regarding future courses. Students and parents will first input course requests in Power School, then students will sign up for individual student-counselor meetings throughout the coming weeks to finalize selections, review requirements, and discuss current and future goals. Detailed information will be distributed to students at school and posted to the counseling website when available.

Counselors will be meeting with students individually throughout March to discuss course requests for next year, future college and career plans, graduation requirements, and current progress. During that meeting counselors will make any necessary or preferred changes to a student's future course requests in PowerSchool.

Testing Out

Non-Math Test Out Sign Up will start Wednesday, February 21, 2024, and will end Wednesday, March 20, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. THIS IS A HARD DEADLINE! No late sign-ups will be allowed. To register: Log into your PowerSchool Account. Open Waiving a NON MATH Course through Testing Out. Once a student registers, Mrs. Modetz from the counseling office will send the information regarding that particular test, including the syllabus, date, location and time to the student's Troy Schools email address. The Math Test Out sign up is TBD.

Attention Seniors

All students are advised not to let up on studies or allow their grades to drop second semester. Eighth-semester grades (final transcripts) are sent to a student's college of choice, and a student's admission status can be jeopardized if his/her grades show a notable decline, so beware of "senioritis." Seniors should doublecheck graduation status with their counselors if graduation might be in jeopardy.

Financial Aid

It is strongly recommended all seniors complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), which will be used to determine a student's eligibility for federal and state grants, scholarships, and loans. For example, the Michigan Competitive Scholarship is based on a student's standardized test score and financial need, which is determined by filing the FAFSA. The FAFSA is now available online at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>. The FAFSA is a free service; please be wary of other web applications for the FAFSA that cost money (i.e. www.fafsa.com). The FAFSA should be completed and submitted to ensure a student is given the maximum opportunity to qualify for and receive aid. In addition, it is strongly advised that students check with the financial aid office at the college or institution which they will attend to see if any supplemental information is required. Please contact a college's financial aid office for more information.

Juniors - NCAA eligibility

All junior athletes who may be interested in playing Div. I or Div. II athletics in college must be NCAA eligible. In order to do this, students must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse and meet eligibility requirements. Registering should be done junior year by going to the following website: www.eligibilitycenter.org. Students will also use www.parchment.com to send transcripts to NCAA.

Testing Information

PSAT- Current juniors who took the PSAT last fall can view their results on the College Board website. Students and parents who have questions, need clarification, or wish to discuss the test results are encouraged to contact their student's counselor. All current freshmen and sophomores are scheduled to take the PSAT 9 or PSAT 10 in April.

SAT- Free practice tests for SAT are available at www.sat.org as well as registration information and additional test dates. Counselors also recommend using Khan Academy for free, personalized online practice. Other links are available on the counseling website. Juniors are scheduled to take the SAT and M-STEP in April for free at Troy High School.

ACT- Students interested in taking the ACT should go to www.act.org for exam dates and registration. It is normally recommended students take either the SAT or ACT as juniors in order to be prepared for the application process starting in September of senior year; however, many colleges are now "test optional" or "test flexible" with regards to standardized testing, so individual actions may vary. Please refer to university websites for the most up to date information on test-optional or test-flexible policies.

Footloose Theatre Production

Box Office opens for Troy Theatre Ensemble's 2024 Spring Musical "Footloose"

The Troy Theatre Ensemble, Troy High School's award-winning theatre troupe, is opened . TTE's Footloose features a cast, stage crew and pit crew of more than 80 students.

Based on the 1984 film starring Kevin Bacon, *Footloose* is the story of Ren McCormack, a teenage boy from Chicago. When Ren and his mother move to a small farming town, he is prepared for the inevitable adjustment period at his new high school. But he's not prepared for the rigorous local edicts, including a ban on dancing instituted by the local preacher, who is determined to exercise control over the town's youth.
