



Giving Families Choices High School Family Privacy Options

There are four ways families may ask schools to withhold student-related information. These default to Yes for all students, so this form is used to either opt out or opt back in after previously opting out.

1. Release student information to the Military (**ONLY** 11th and 12th graders).

2. Publish information in the PTSA Student Directory – this includes student and parent names, address, grade, phone number, and email address.

3. Share information with King County Library System in order to receive an electronic library card – this includes student name, ID number, and date of birth. Selecting No will opt the student out of receiving an electronic library card.

Colleges: Selecting Yes would allow student information to be shared with Washington State Colleges as requested by OSPI for the purpose of informing students of post-secondary opportunities, including but not limited to access to the Guaranteed Admissions Program.
