

Budget Expenditures


Including <u>all</u> warrant articles, FY25 Hanover District budget expenditures proposed to increase 3.1% or \$473K



Investments in school building improvements and administration are supported by decreases in special education tuition




Year over Year Change FY25 vs FY24

Ray School Operations

Ray School enrollment is expected to be the same as this year, FY24 actual lower than budget due to small Kindergarten cohort



Budgeted FY25 Ray School Enrollment: 438 students


The Ray School plans a 2.4 FTE net decrease for FY25 staffing

Ray School Full-time equivalent (FTE) change from FY24 Budget



Revenue & Net Assessment

Net assessment is proposed to increase 4.8% or \$567K, driven by anticipated loss of state revenue and one-time infusion from prior year



Projected Tax Rates

FY<u>24</u> Hanover education property tax increase was nearly <u>50% less</u> than projected at March vote


More operating surplus largely due to staffing shortages


Hanover education tax is combination of local and state school taxes

Hanover education property tax rates projected to increase 2.7%


Assumes all warrant articles pass (Hanover and Dresden)




Hanover Education Tax Rates

Now at 2.5%, regional inflation has fallen since last year's historic highs




Over-the-year percent change in CPI-Northeast region (January 2024)


