# **Elementary Division**

### From the Division Principal

Learning is a social activity. Although there are certainly times during the day when classrooms are quiet—and students are working individually—quite often there is a "buzz" in St. John's learning environments. As I visit our students at work, it is fascinating to see how they interact with each other: sometimes they are commenting on each other's ideas, sometimes they are providing peer feedback, and sometimes they are simply commending each other. No matter what, though, they are learning together.

As we launch Writers Workshop K–5, one particular component of this approach to developing young authors is the idea of "writing partners." In the picture below, a first-grade writer is sharing his writing with a kindergarten buddy. Not only are these students actively partnered with each other in order to share work, but our first graders are serving as role models while our younger students aspire to develop skills like their older partners.



Classroom partnerships allow this type of exchange to occur. Partnering also teaches our students that, as authors, it is essential to consider your audience. When our Cardinals are partnered with each other frequently, they are able to see and hear how their peers are growing. They are also able to write to each other as their "audience." Rather than always turning in work to their teacher (or parents), students in partnerships have the exciting opportunity to interact with each other. After all, who better to appreciate their topics of interest than their very own friends and classmates?

On Tuesday, our teachers participated in a similar exercise. Under the direction of First-Grade Teacher Ms. McLennan, faculty in kindergarten through fifth grade worked together by grade levels to examine their students' writing (see picture below). By going through a protocol, teachers were able to review rubrics, sort students' writing into different groups, individually evaluate the writing against a rubric, and then discuss how each of them arrived at conclusions. This process of calibrating students' writing was a learning experience—one that will better prepare us to address the strengths and support the growth of our student writers.



As we continue our dive into Writers Workshop, I encourage parents to speak to their children about their writing lives. Ask questions about their "writing toolkit," particularly the strategies that they are learning. As they show their writing to you, ask them to explain what they are doing as writers. Remember, it's not just the topic of their writing that matters, but also the writing process. To sum up an important idea, we teach the "writer," not just the "writing."

# **Middle Division**

#### From the Division Principal

What is a podcast? It is an audio file created by the host to inform, inspire, and engage a target audience. It was fantastic to see our own Middle Division students utilizing podcast creation as an innovative, project-based learning experience in sixth-grade English.

The students began the process by listening to "The Unexplainable Disappearance of Mars Patel," an award-winning, scripted podcast created for middle school students by other middle school students. During the listening phase of the project, students took notes, predicted, summarized, and visualized each episode. Next came the interactive portion of the project, where the students used their own mental pictures to bring key elements of the podcast to life by building a temporary shelter and a mini catapult. The end goal was to help these future podcast creators develop critical-thinking skills, understand the key elements of a podcast, and learn how to draw the listener in.

Now armed with thorough knowledge of what it takes to create a good podcast, students used their creativity to brainstorm their own ideas. The emphasis on planning, scriptwriting, and understanding the different components of a podcast—including the introduction, core content, and conclusion—was crucial for developing effective communication skills.

After they settled on a topic, students took on the task of writing their own scripts so that they were fully prepared for the podcast-recording process. Key considerations during the recording process included identifying their target audience and incorporating a theme song, sound

effects, and even a message from a sponsor. This mirrored the real-world aspects of podcast production.

The culminating step was the use of the platform Flipgrid to record their own three-to-five-minute podcasts, and then showcasing their work to their peers. Our sixth graders took pride in their podcasts, and enjoyed listening to their classmates' creations. Podcast topics were diverse, and included "Island Discovery Institute, " "Clipper Nation, " "All About Dogs, " "Perfect Chocolate Chip Cookies, " "All Things Aviation, " and "January 2024 Hotline News. " As you can see, there was quite a range of titles, and the podcasts reflected students' personal interests while allowing for a wide variety of content.

Who knows—we may have a future podcast creator in the Middle Division, and this may be the spark they needed to pursue their passion!
