



Peter Ahnert, Sr.

Mr. Ahnert is a graduate of East Stroudsburg High School, Class of 1959 and he earned a degree in Hotel and Resort Management from Paul Smith's College (NY). He also served in the U.S. Army from 1962 to 1964. Mr. Ahnert was the manager of Fernwood Resort from 1964 to 1974, and served as President of Ahnert Enterprises from 1974 to 1988, and as President of Rank-Ahnert Inc. from 1988 to 1992. Peter also assisted in the development of Keystone Hollow Corporation and Nicklaus Golf and Country Club in 1994. He has been honored with the Humanitarian Award by St. John's Catholic Church Lay Apostolate Association, he received the Thomas Cullen Memorial Award for Community Service from the Pocono Mountain Vacation Bureau, and was also presented the Outstanding Leadership Award by the Pennsylvania Hall of Fame for Older Workers. Mr. Ahnert has served on the Boards of the Pocono Community Bank, Security Bank and Trust, the Mountain Laurel Center for the Performing Arts, the East Stroudsburg University Foundation, the Pocono Mountains Vacation Bureau, Paul Smith's College, Notre Dame High School and the Pennsylvania Land Developer's Association.

Florence Dyer Baldwin

Ms. Dyer Baldwin is a graduate of East Stroudsburg High School, Class of 1936. She earned a B.A. degree from the University of Michigan (1940), an M.S. in Civil Engineering from Michigan State University (1950), and became a registered architect in 1954. She worked as a project architect at the University of California, Berkeley for more than 40 years. Florence is a member of the Order of the Golden Bear, was awarded the Berkeley Citation "for distinguished achievement and for notable service to the university" in 1992 and received the Berkeley Medal, "In honor of distinguished service to the Carillon" in 1983, for her work on the renovation of a campus landmark, the 303 foot Sather Tower (also known as "The Campanile"). Improvements to the tower included the addition of new bells to create a 61 bell carillon. She served as project manager for design and construction of the Recreational Sports Facility, one of the main athletic centers on campus (the building, completed in 1984, won a national design award from the American Institute of Architects). Other noteworthy projects include the Haas School of Business (1992-1995) and a major addition to Doe Memorial Library (the main library on campus and one of the largest libraries in the world, 1992-1994). Ms. Dyer Baldwin also worked on a number of projects involving laboratories and other specialized science facilities, including the Space Sciences Laboratory, the Marine Biology Laboratory at Bodega Bay, and Soda Hall (computer science), along with additions or alterations to many other buildings including Wheeler Hall (1973), Minor Hall/School of Optometry (1977-1978), and the International House (1977-1978 and 1981-1982). In her many years of participation in the Berkeley campus community, Florence has earned a reputation for humor and diplomacy as well as exacting standards.





Dawn R. Eilenberger

Ms. Eilenberger is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School, Class of 1975, where she was a member of the field hockey, basketball and track and field teams, and the Student Council. At ESHS, Dawn was honored by “Who’s Who Among American High School Students,” the “Society of Distinguished American High School Students,” and received a National Merit Scholarship Program letter of commendation. She earned a B.A. degree in History and Political Science (summa cum laude, Phi Beta Kappa) from Muhlenberg College in 1979, and a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Virginia School of Law in 1982. Ms. Eilenberger has held numerous positions of responsibility within the ranks of the Central Intelligence Agency, serving as an agency attorney (1982-1988), Chief of the Special Activities Division (1988-1992), Chief of the Administrative Law Division (1992-1994), Director of the Office of Equal Employment Opportunity (1994-1995), Principal Deputy General Counsel (1995-1999) and the Director of Finance (1999-2005). Most recently, Dawn has served as the Deputy Director of the Security and Installations Directorate (2006-2007) and as Director of the Office of International Affairs and Policy (2007-to present) at the National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency (NGA). She received the Intelligence Medal of Merit and the Meritorious Officer Award from the Senior Intelligence Service and has served on the Boards of Directors of the Northwest Federal Credit Union and the Government Employees Health Association, as well as the Editorial Boards of the Geospatial Intelligence Review and Studies in Intelligence. Ms. Eilenberger has remained active in women’s recreational soccer, with her teams winning national medals and awards in Over-30, Over-40 and Over-50 divisions.

Curt Kolcun

Mr. Kolcun is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School, Class of 1979. At ESHS, Curt was an honor student, and participated in band, baseball and golf. Upon graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force, serving in the military airlift command. Mr. Kolcun was employed in the private sector as a systems engineer from 1983 to 1989. He then joined Microsoft Corporation in 1989 and was promoted to Vice President of Microsoft’s Federal Government Business (2003) and Vice President of Microsoft’s United States Public Sector (2008). Curt is responsible for Microsoft’s business in U.S. federal, state and local government and educational markets and has received numerous awards in recognition of industry and civic contribution. Ms. Mutchler has worked as an investigative journalist for the Allentown (PA) Morning Call newspaper (1988-1989), and for the Associated Press in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Illinois and Arkansas (1989-1995). She served as the Associated Press Senior reporter in Pennsylvania (1989-1992), and as the the A.P. Statehouse Bureau Chief in Illinois (1993-1994) and Alaska (1994-1995). Terry served as Senior Advisor/Spokeswoman/Speechwriter/Campaign Strategist for The Honorable Penny Severns, Illinois Senate Minority Whip, from 1995 through 1998, and as a Law Clerk in both the Office of Management and Budget in the Executive Office of the President of the United States (Clinton Administration, 1998) and for Illinois Supreme Court Justice Benjamin K. Miller (1999-2000). She was a Litigation Attorney for the law firm of Foley and Lardner (Chicago, IL, 2001-2003), and served as a Public Access Counselor for the Office of Illinois Attorney General Lisa Madigan from 2003 through 2007. Ms. Mutchler presently serves as the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Office of Open Records, having been appointed to a six-year term by Governor Edward G. Rendell.
