Graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School, Class of 1972...As an ESHS student, participated in 4 years of band (playing the French horn), spent 6 years as a majorette, 6 years in the school chorus and 5 years on the staff of the school newspaper...Upon graduation from ESHS, attended East Stroudsburg State College (from 1972-1975), majoring in Biology...Became a partner in the ownership and operation of eleven childcare facilities in the Lehigh Valley and Slate Belt areas...Later decided to continue postsecondary education, first studying Business Administration and Accounting at Northampton Community College, then earning an AAUW scholarship and returning to ESU to complete a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology (1991-93), graduating with cum laude honors...Advanced to medical school at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine on a full (National Health Service Corps) scholarship, obtaining her D.O. degree in 1997...Served her medical internship at St. Luke's Hospital (Allentown) from 1997-98, earning the "Academic Excellence Intern of the Year" Award...Served her medical residency at St. Luke's Hospital (Bethlehem) from 1998-2000, earning the "Wilfred E. Vogler, M.D. Excellence in the Art of Family Practice" Award and serving on the St. Luke's Hospital Ethics Committee...Worked as a family practice physician through 2006, also working as a physician, devoting her energies to children in need at the KidsPeace Hospital for kids in crisis...Since January, 2006, has worked as an emergency room physician at Broaddus Hospital in Philippi, West Virginia, and serves as a member of the auxiliary teaching staff at both West Virginia University and Alderson-Broaddus College, training medical students, residents and physicians assistants...Her certifications include Advanced Trauma Life Support, Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support, Healthcare Provider Basic Life Support as well as Advanced Pediatric Life Support...Has also served as the Broaddus Hospital Vice President of Medical Staff and President of Physician Credentialing (2009-2012), as well as President of Quality Assurance (2009 to date).
