

2019 Inductees into the East Stroudsburg Area School District Meritorious Hall of Fame

Arthur “Skip” Moeller, D.O.



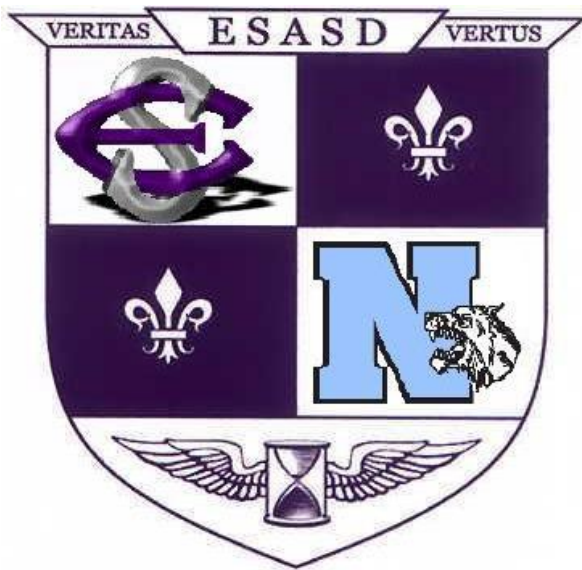
Skip was born and raised in East Stroudsburg, completing grades K-12 all within the East Stroudsburg Area School District, and graduating in 1991. At ESHS, he served as Class Vice President, while participating in Model United Nations, Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science, Ski Club, and Chess Club. Skip played football all 4 years, earning First-Team All-League selection after his senior year, and he is a member of the Cavalier Football Wall of Fame. During his junior year, Skip completed coursework at the Monroe County Area Vocational Technical School leading to his certification as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), and began his lifelong pursuit of medical education, volunteering as an EMT with General Ambulance Corp in Stroudsburg, PA. In 1993, he graduated from the Lancaster Paramedic Institute and began working

as a Paramedic with Monroe County Medic-7, as well as Northampton County's Medic-9 and Suburban Rescue. Skip earned a Bachelor of Science degree in 1997, in Health Care Management and Physician Assistant Studies from the State University of New York at Stony Brook, and was awarded the 1997 Dean's Award for Excellence in Leadership. He earned a Master of Medical Science degree in 2001 from a combined program with Alderson-Broadus College/West Virginia University. He worked as a Physician Assistant in the field of Emergency Medicine from 1997-2010 in Central Pennsylvania, Northern Colorado and Metro Las Vegas, NV. He was a core faculty member and director of Emergency Medicine curriculum from 2000-2006 at Red Rocks College, Lakewood, Colorado. Skip also served as a Clinical Instructor for various Physician Assistant, Nursing, and Medical Schools from 1999-present. He earned a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree in 2010 from Touro University-Nevada, and at the end of his 1st year of medical school, received the college's award for Student of the Year. He served as Student Body President in his 2nd year, and as a 3rd year med. student, served as the medical student representative to a national council of Medical School Dean's Committee on Medical Education. He completed a Surgical internship and residency training, leading to board certification in the surgical subspecialty of Otolaryngology/Head and Neck Surgery/Facial Plastic Surgery from 2010-2015 with Michigan State University at the St John Providence health care system, Warren, Michigan and was named the winner of the 2015 St John/Providence Award for Excellence in Medical Research. Currently Skip is in private practice with Avera Medical Group in Yankton, S.D., while also constantly promoting and supporting local youth athletics through his roles as a high school and youth football official, youth football coach, and a USA Hockey certified player and goalie coach.

Russell D. Scott III



Russ is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School, Class of 1964. While at ESHS, his high school activities included 3 years of varsity basketball, 3 years of varsity baseball and 1 year of varsity golf. After graduation from ESHS, he embarked in post-graduate education at Valley Forge Military Academy and the University of Denver, Colorado. Russ was the third-generation owner of Mountain Manor Inn and Golf Club, a family-owned business serving the community for 73 years in Marshalls Creek, PA. He stepped into the role of President of Mountain Manor Inc. for 23 years, from 1983 to 2006. Over the years Russ personally built and designed 54 holes of golf at Mt. Manor—the most of any golf club on the East coast—and Thunder Creek Quarry Family Entertainment Center in 1997. He currently serves as President and owner of Dunbar Enterprises, Inc., offering equipment rental, yard-scaping and excavation services since 2005. In addition, he serves his community as President of the Monroe County Historical Association (8 years), on the Board of Directors of the MCHA (13 years), and on the Board of Directors at the Pocono Mountain Economic Development Corporation (since 2013). Russ has enhanced our region through numerous community construction projects, designing and building softball and soccer fields at Water Front Park in Smithfield Township and at Minisink Park, on behalf of East Stroudsburg Youth Association, on both sides of the railroad tracks in Smithfield Township. He also built the parking lot and upgraded the baseball field at Rock Tenn, Smithfield Township and constructed the parking lot and landscaped Pierce-Yeasley log cabin at Smithfield Park, Smithfield Township. Russ has served in local government for over 30 years, as Chairman of the Smithfield Township Zoning Hearing Board (from 1973 to 1988) and as Chairman of the Township Sewer Authority from its inception in 1988 thru 2011, also serving to complete Smithfield Township Supervisor Al Wilson's term in 2002. He also served as Chairman of the Committee to Elect Judge Jennifer Harlacher Sibum and as a member of the Committee to Elect Judge Jonathan Mark. Russ has also volunteered as a YMCA youth softball coach for 9 years and as an East Stroudsburg Little League coach for 2 years. His civic memberships over the last 50 years also have included: 7 years on the Leadership Council of the National Federation of Independent Business, Board member of Pocono Heritage Land Trust and the Pennsylvania Turf Grass Council, extended membership in the Barger Lodge #325 Stroudsburg, Keystone Consistory of Scranton Valley, East Stroudsburg United Methodist Church, National Rifle Association, United States Golf Association, National Federation of Wild Sheep, Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation, Ducks Unlimited, Deer Quality Management and the National Geographic Society. Russ's honors and awards have included NE Pennsylvania Family Business of the Year (finalist in 1998 and winner in 1999), International Association of Amusement Parks and Attractions "Golden Ring Award" for Family Entertainment outdoor ad and radio ad categories (1999), Chamber of Commerce "Save the Planet" Award for wastewater reclamation (1999) and Professional Recyclers of Pennsylvania "Waste Watcher Award" for small business recycling program (2000).
