

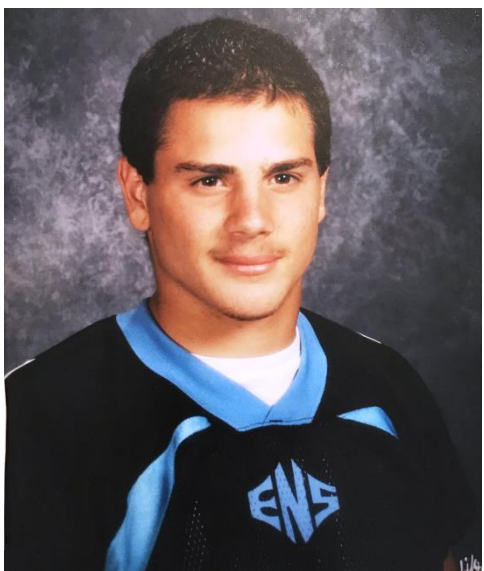
2019 Inductees into the East Stroudsburg Area School District Athletic Hall of Fame

Jocelyn Davis



Jocelyn is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-North, Class of 2008, having moved to North prior to the beginning of her senior year in high school (2007-08). She earned the Mountain Valley Conference and District XI Class AAA girls' tennis #1 singles championships, advancing to PIAA State AAA tennis championship competition with an undefeated record, while earning a bronze medal (3rd place finish) in PIAA singles competition, losing her only match of the season in the State semi-finals. After graduation from ES-North, Jocelyn attended Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo (California) University—competing very successfully for four years in varsity intercollegiate tennis. In leading the Cal Poly women's tennis program to unprecedented success, she earned All-Big West Conference acclaim. She earned her B.S. degree in Psychology from Cal Poly in 2013, and a Master's degree in Middle Eastern Studies and Arabic from Tel Aviv University in 2018.

Jon Clouse



Jon is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-North, Class of 2007. During his Timberwolf athletic career, he earned 7 varsity letters, 3 in football and 4 in track and field. Jon earned recognition in football as a First-Team All-Area wide receiver in 2004, 2005, and 2006; a First-Team Safety in 2006; and a First-Team Punter in 2006. He was also named the HS-North Football MVP Award winner in 2006 and 2007, and was recognized as the Pocono Record "Football Player of the Year" in the fall of 2006. In Track and Field, Jon earned League Championship honors in the javelin in 2005, 2006, and 2007 and in the long jump and 100 meter dash in 2007; while also winning the District XI Championship in both the long jump (with a 22' 9" jump), and in the 4x100 relay (with a time of 42.8 seconds). In addition, he qualified for PIAA State competition in the javelin, 100 meter dash, long jump, and 4x100 relay, while also being named "Athlete of the Week" by TV-13 in 2007. Today Jon runs his own construction business "Jon Clouse Restorations," all while balancing the fundamentals of being a great dad.

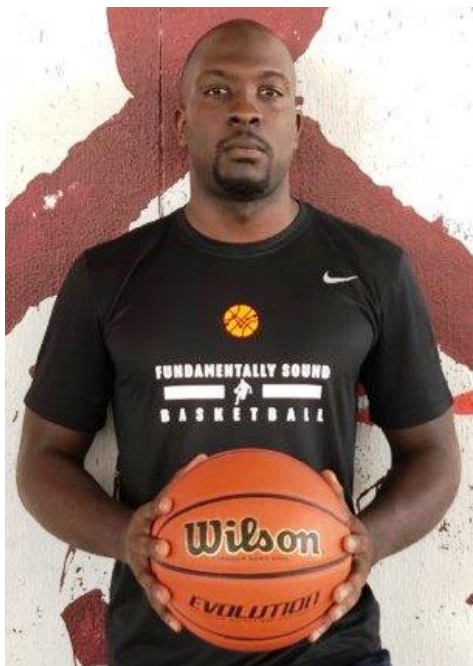
Angelique Horowitz



Angelique is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-North, Class of 2010. During her Timberwolf athletic career, she earned 7 varsity letters, 4 in soccer and 3 in volleyball. In soccer, Angelique led the T-Wolves in scoring during both her junior and senior years, while earning recognition as a First-Team All-MVC selection, as well as the the Jay Effross Memorial Work Ethic Award, the Union League of Philadelphia Good Citizenship Award and the Mountain Valley Conference Most Outstanding Player Award, while also being honored as the T-Wolves' Most Valuable Athlete Award winner for soccer in both her junior and senior years ('08-'09 and '09-'10). In addition, she received the ESASD Scholar-Athlete Award, while also being nominated for consideration as a Lehigh Valley Scholar Athlete, and serving as Team Captain during her senior year. In volleyball, Angelique

served as Team Captain during both her junior and senior years, while also being recognized as a First-Team, All-MVC selection, and the Timberwolf Volleyball Most Valuable Athlete during both years. She also was named the East Stroudsburg-North Best All-Around Female Athlete Award winner at the conclusion of her senior year. Angelique went on to tremendous success in soccer at Virginia Wesleyan College, earning recognition as a Second-Team All-Old Dominion Athletic Conference defender in 2012, and as a First-Team All-Old Dominion Athletic Conference defender, Second Team All-Virginia and Second-Team All-South Region player in 2013. She currently serves as the Assistant General Manager and Sports Director at the Virginia Beach Field House.

Will Porter



Will is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-North, Class of 2006. During his Timberwolf basketball career, he earned 4 varsity letters, while becoming the first (and still the only) male to score 1,000 points (1,233) in East Stroudsburg-North history. Will earned All-Mountain Valley Conference Honorable Mention recognition as a sophomore, Second-Team as a junior, and First-Team honors as a senior. He was recognized as the T-Wolf Basketball Most Valuable Athlete Award winner in 2004, 2005 and 2006. After graduation from North, Will played college basketball in the Philippines (averaging 17.4 points and 7.1 assists per game); semi-professional basketball in the Philippines (averaging 25.2 points and 11.3 rebounds per game); and professional basketball also in the Philippines (averaging 27.1 points and 5.8 rebounds per game).

The East Stroudsburg Area School District Athletic Hall of Fame was created in 2002 to honor those who have brought honor and prestige to our school district and our athletic program.
