

2016 Inductees into the East Stroudsburg Area School District Athletic Hall of Fame

Kyle Anger



Kyle is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-South, Class of 2007. Kyle earned four varsity letters in his Cavalier swimming career, receiving the Most Valuable Athlete Award as a senior in 2007. He set five school records, in the 200 medley relay, 200 IM, 100 freestyle, 100 breaststroke and 400 freestyle. As an underclassman, Kyle won Mountain Valley Conference Championships in the 200 medley relay, 200 individual medley and 400 freestyle relay, while qualifying to participate in District (2005 and 2006) and State (2005) competition, placing 3rd in Districts, 9th in States, also earning NISAC Top 16 and Pennsylvania High School Swimming Coaches Association All-State Honorable Mention Awards (in the 100 breaststroke). As a senior (2007), he won MVC Championships in the 100 freestyle, 100 breaststroke and 200 freestyle, and qualified to compete in Districts (placing 2nd) and States (placing 7th), also winning Pennsylvania High School Swimming Coaches Association All-State recognition (in the 100 breaststroke).

Kevin Reese



Kevin is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-South, Class of 2003, where he was inducted into the National Honor Society, while earning a total of nine varsity letters in football, basketball and baseball. He was honored with selection as the Most Valuable Player in both basketball and baseball, while also receiving the Best All-Around Male Athlete Award as a senior. In football, Kevin played defensive back, wide receiver and placekicker, while also serving as team captain (2002). He received 1st Team All-League and All-Area honors (2001, 2002) and was selected to participate in the McDonalds All-Star game, while also receiving the Lehigh Valley Chapter National Football Foundation Scholar Athlete Award. In basketball, Kevin played shooting guard, while also serving as team captain (2003), and was named 1st Team All-League and All-Area, also being selected as both the Cavaliers' Most Valuable Player (2003) and Scholar Athlete Award winner. In baseball, Kevin played shortstop and pitcher, serving as team captain (2003). He was named 2nd Team All-League and 1st Team All-Area (2002), 1st Team All-League and All-Area (2003) and received 2nd Team All-Morning Call honors (2003). After high school graduation, he attended Blair Academy (2004), participating in football (earning 1st Team All MAPL Conference and 1st Team All-State honors), and baseball (earning 1st Team All MAPL Conference and 1st Team All-State honors, while also earning the team's Most Valuable Player Award). After Blair, Kevin entered Lafayette College where he played Division IAA Football for 2 years and Division IA baseball for 4 years, graduating in 2008. While at Lafayette, Kevin played wide receiver and placekicker as a member of 2 Patriot League Football Championship teams (2004, 2005); and starting pitcher, serving as team captain (2008), as a member of a Patriot League Baseball Championship team that also participated in the NCAA IA Northeast Regional Tournament (2007). Kevin finished his Lafayette career among the Leopards' all-time leaders in wins (6th), innings pitched (5th), strikeouts (157—9th) and career ERA, while earning All-Patriot League Team honors, and being named Patriot League Player of the Week 5-times, as well as receiving the team's Most Valuable Pitcher Award and being named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll (2007, 2008). Following his senior season in 2008, Kevin signed his first professional contract with the Washington WildThings of the Frontier League, spending the 2009 and 2010 seasons in the Frontier League, playing for the Traverse City Beach Bums. In 2010, he finished as the league leader in games started, while being selected to the East Division All-Star Team, as his team won the Eastern Conference Championship. During his next two seasons, Kevin played for the Somerset Patriots (2011) and the Camden Riversharks (2012), compiling over 200 innings and over 100 strikeouts in Atlantic League competition. Kevin also had the opportunity to play winter baseball in the MLB-sanctioned Australian Baseball League for the Melbourne Aces, competing in the 2012 ABL Championship Series, while being selected to the ABL World All-Star Team (2013) and as one of the Top 40 American players playing in the Australian Baseball League. In 2013, Kevin played for the Newark Bears of the CanAm League, capping off a 6 year professional baseball career. Kevin currently resides in Stroudsburg, PA, working for Sanofi Pasteur, while serving as a baseball coach at Blair Academy.

Lauren (Reese) Bross



Lauren graduated from East Stroudsburg Area High School in 1999, where she was inducted into the National Honor Society, while earning ten varsity letters, playing soccer, basketball and tennis. She was named the Most Valuable Player in both soccer and basketball. In Cavalier soccer, Lauren played center mid-fielder and served as team captain all four years, while being selected as a Mountain Valley Conference 1st Team All-League performer three years in a row, and was awarded the team's Most Valuable Player Award twice. She also played for the Travel Select Stroudsburg United Soccer Club from 1991 to 1999. In Cavalier basketball, Lauren was the starting shooting guard and captain for four years, while being named Mountain Valley Conference 1st Team All-League during the 1998-1999 season and was awarded the team's Most Valuable Player Award twice. She also played two years of Cavalier tennis, participating in singles and doubles competitions while qualifying for District playoff competition during the 1998 season. Lauren was honored with selection as the Best All-Around Female Athlete Award winner in 1999, and became the first Cavalier female soccer athlete to receive a Division IA Athletic Scholarship, attending Drexel University. She played four years on the Drexel Dragons women's soccer team as the starting forward, and participated in the NCAA IA Colonial Athletic Conference Playoffs in 2000. She graduated Cum Laude from Drexel University with a B.S.

Degree in Education, later earning her Masters degree in Education from Lock Haven University, as well as 30 additional graduate credits. Lauren is married to Andy Bross, and is the proud mother of 3 children (Ava, Jake, and Brooke). She has served as a teacher for 13 years, most recently in the Lower Merion School District as a 4th grade teacher.

Kelly Terwilliger



Kelly is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-South, Class of 2004, where she earned 12 varsity letters for the Cavaliers—4 in field hockey, 4 in basketball and 4 in soccer—and was a 4-year varsity starter, serving as team captain in all 3 sports. She earned field hockey First Team All-State honors in 2003, and Second Team All-State honors in 2002, while being named Cavalier field hockey team MVP 3 times. Kelly was also named All-Conference and All-Area in field hockey, soccer and basketball. She competed in the Junior Olympic Games and Keystone State Games for field hockey in 2001 & 2002, while also participating in the USFHA Futures Elite Program from 2000 through 2004, additionally competing at the field hockey National Indoor Tournament for 2 years, and traveled with the USFHA U-18 team in 2003 for the Australian Tour. Academically, Kelly was a National Honor Society student, named Who's Who Among American High School Students and received the East Stroudsburg Scholar Athlete Award, graduating in the top 10 percent of her class while also volunteering for the Special Olympics. She graduated Cum Laude from The Ohio State University in 2009, having earned a 4-year field hockey scholarship. Kelly started every game in her 4 seasons with the Buckeyes, earning The Ohio State University's Team Most Valuable Defender in 2007, while also being named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team. During her career, the Buckeyes won the Big Ten Conference Championship and were NCAA Elite 8 participants in 2006, and NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 participants in 2005 and 2007. She was a 4-time Ohio State Scholar-Athlete and Academic All-Big Ten, also receiving The Ohio State University Buckeye Power Club Award, given annually to an athlete who exemplifies leadership. Kelly received two Masters degrees in 2011, from the Patton College of Education (in Coaching Education) and the College of Business (Sports Administration) from Ohio University. Kelly's passion and career has been in coaching field hockey at the collegiate level and she has worked as the Associate Head Coach at Indiana University, Assistant Coach at The Ohio State University and Assistant Coach at Ohio University. A 2014 graduate of the NCAA Women's Coaching Academy, Kelly is actively involved with United States Field Hockey Association, holding a level 2 coaching certification and is annually selected to coach for the USA National High Performance program and is a Regional Head Coach/selector for the Futures Elite Program, identifying and coaching Olympic level talent.

Leyon Azubuiké



Leyon is a graduate of East Stroudsburg Area High School-South, Class of 2004. During his Cavalier athletic career, he participated in football, basketball and track & field. Leyon, however, really excelled in football, selected as the Co-Player of the Year by the Pocono Record, First Team All-Mountain Valley Conference, First Team All-Area by the Allentown Morning Call, and was named Class AAAA Third Team All-State by the Pennsylvania Football News while also being selected to play in the 2004 “Big 33” Game. Upon graduation from ESHS-South, he was presented a full scholarship to play football at Temple University, earning 3 varsity letters, and serving as team captain during the 2007 season. Leyon has served as a strength and conditioning coach and is the former owner the Azubuiké Boxing Academy, and presently is the owner of Gloveworx-USA (a boxing and athletic performance facility, which opened in May, 2015), all located in Santa Monica, California. He previously had a hand in developing a number of fitness centers on the west side of Los Angeles prior to opening his own gym. Also, Leyon is a nationally recognized actor in the SAG-AFTRA Union, from 2010 to date.

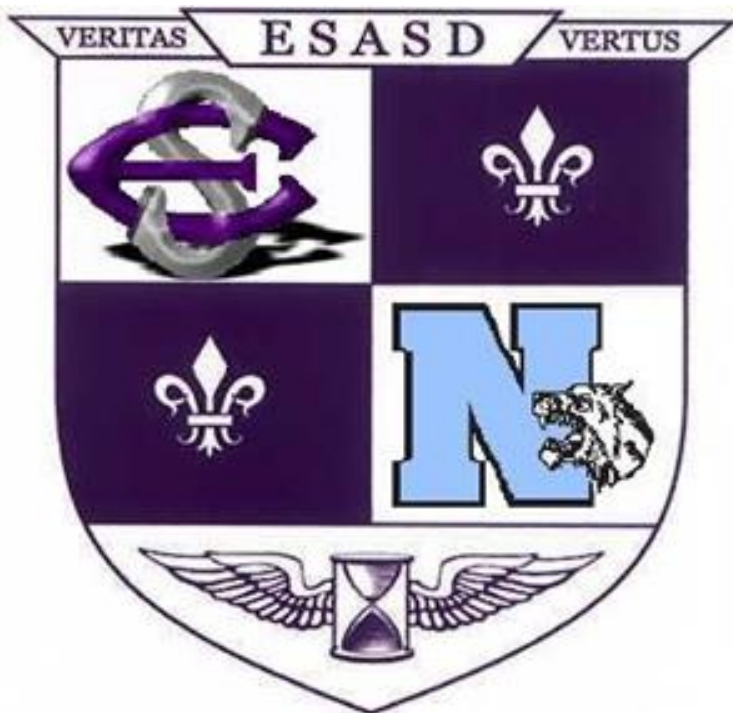
The 1982 East Stroudsburg Cavalier Girls’ Basketball Team

The 1982 East Stroudsburg Cavalier Girls’ Basketball Team was the first girls’ sports team in East Stroudsburg history to win a league championship. They defeated Palmerton, who had won the previous 3 Centennial League Championships, 46-37, in a league championship playoff game at the “old” Pocono Mountain High School gymnasium. They then advanced to defeat arguably the greatest girls’ basketball team in Stroudsburg H.S. history, 54-36, in the District XI consolation game, to become the first Monroe County girls’ basketball team to qualify for P.I.A.A. State competition.

The East Stroudsburg Area School District Athletic Hall of Fame was created in 2002, to honor those who have brought honor and prestige to our school district, and our athletic program.
