Angela is a graduate of East Stroudsburg High School, Class of 1992. She earned four varsity letters in track and field, garnering 12 Centennial League gold medals, including the 4 X 100 (1989, 1991 and 1992); 4 X 400 (1989); 100 meter dash (1990, 1991 and 1992); 200 meter dash (1990, 1991 and 1992); and 400 meter dash (1991 and 1992). Angela also won 11 District XI gold medals and qualified to participate in P.I.A.A. State Track—in the 4 X 100 (1989, 1990, 1991 and 1992); 100 meter dash (1990, 1991 and 1992); 200 meter dash (1990 and 1991); and 400 meter dash (1991 and 1992). In addition, she earned P.I.A.A. State Track medals in the 400 meter dash (5th place in 1991 and 3rd place in 1992). Angela was named the Cavalier Girls' Track "Most Valuable Athlete" in 1990, 1991 and 1992, and currently holds Cavalier school records in the 100, 200, 400, 4 X 100, 4 X 400, sprint medley and interval relay. She also played four years of Cavalier girls' basketball, earning 3 varsity letters, while playing on the 1990 and 1991 Centennial League Championship girls' basketball teams. Angela presently resides in Emmaus, PA with the "joys in her life,"

Lauren Litts

Lauren is a graduate of East Stroudsburg-South, Class of 2003. A four-year varsity softball letter winner, she also earned varsity letters in tennis and basketball. Lauren achieved numerous softball awards, including 3-times as a 1st-Team All-Mountain Valley Conference selection, four-times All-Area honors, 1st-Team All-Lehigh Valley as a senior and selection as the Pocono Record "Player of the Year" in 2003. She holds Cavalier softball records for batting average (.574 in 2003); runs batted in (23 in 2002); and did not strike out one time during her junior or senior years, in 54 at bats. Lauren's Cavalier softball career batting statistics include a batting average of .508, with 88 hits, 9 home runs, 11 triples, 19 doubles and 62 runs batted in. She went on to play Division I collegiate softball on a full scholarship at Bucknell University, graduating in 2007 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English. At Bucknell, Lauren was a four-year starter and letter winner, serving as team co-captain during her senior year.



She received mention as the Patriot League "Player of the Week" as a freshman (2004), while garnering First-Team All-Patriot League honors as a designated player and catcher as a sophomore, junior and senior (2005, 2006 and 2007) and was selected All-Mid-Atlantic Region First-Team catcher in 2007. Lauren completed her Bucknell University softball career ranked at, or near the top in single-season batting records, including placing 2nd in games played, 7th in hits, 2nd in doubles, 1st in runs batted in and 1st in home runs; while ranking 5th in games played, 7th in hits, 2nd in doubles, 1st in runs batted in and 1st in home runs for her career. Lauren also served as the volunteer director for the creation of the East Stroudsburg Little League Softball Program from 2007 through 2009 and served as the assistant softball coach at Stroudsburg High School, helping to lead the Mountaineers to the 2010 Mountain Valley Conference and District XI Championships. She is presently pursuing a career in collegiate softball coaching.

William T. "Bill" Reese



Bill is a graduate of East Stroudsburg High School, Class of 1964. He earned six varsity letters at ESHS, three in baseball, two in basketball and one in football. Bill served as team captain for both the baseball and basketball teams and received both the "Student-Athlete" and "Best All-Around Athlete" Awards in 1964. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics/Business from West Virginia Weslevan University in 1969, playing both intercollegiate baseball and basketball at WVWU and earned a degree in Health/Physical Education from East Stroudsburg State College (later to be known as East Stroudsburg University) in 1972. Bill taught health, physical education and driver education at Stroudsburg High School from 1972 until retirement in 2007, also coaching soccer, basketball and baseball at Stroudsburg. He served as the head baseball coach from 1975 through 1996, leading the Mountaineers to the Centennial League Baseball Championship in 1976. Bill also served as junior varsity basketball coach at East Stroudsburg-South H.S. from 2001 through 2003, while also volunteering for many years as a coach for both East Stroudsburg Youth Association and East Stroudsburg Little League programs, with his junior and senior Little League teams advancing to Williamsport for State Championship competition. He was the co-founder of the "resurrected" East

Stroudsburg American Legion Baseball Program (1975), serving as an officer and a coach from 1975 through 2003. Bill played in the (amateur) Wayne County Adult Basketball League, while being selected "Most Valuable Player" in the league's all-star game. He also played in the Pocono Mountain (amateur, adult) Baseball League from 1963 through 1988, and has served as a registered P.I.A.A. basketball official from 1976 to date (2011). Bill was elected to serve on East Stroudsburg Borough Council in 1982, a position that he still holds today (2011). He is a life-long resident of East Stroudsburg who has always strived to support all athletic programs in our community.

Jim graduated from East Stroudsburg-South High School in 2002. He was a three-year varsity letter winner in football at South, leading the Cavaliers to the 2001 Mountain Valley Conference Mountain Division Championship. Jim also earned two varsity letters in basketball. Jim's football honors included a 2002 First-Team All-State selection, a two-time selection as All-Mountain Valley Conference First-Team quarterback and two selections as the All-Pocono Area First-Team quarterback, while throwing for more than 1000 yards in 2000 and 2001. Jim was selected the football team "Most Valuable Player" in 2001, while serving as team captain. He graduated with honors from East Stroudsburg University in 2007, while earning four varsity letters in football. He holds 16 ESU, and 17 NCAA Division II records, and was named a finalist for the "Harlon Hill Award" (the Division II equivalent of the "Heisman Trophy") during all four years, garnering the "Harlon Hill Award" in 2005, as the National "Player of the Year." Jim was named Associated Press "Little All-American" in 2005 and

2006, while also receiving Division II All-American honors in 2004, 2005, 2006. He was named the "National Offensive Player of the Year" in 2003 and 2004. In addition, Jim was honored as First-Team All-Pennsylvania Conference all four years of his collegiate career, while also being named Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference "Player of the Year" three times (2003, 2004, 2006). He was elected team captain and was named team MVP four years in row by his fellow teammates. He was the Lehigh Valley Scholar Athlete nominee for East Stroudsburg University in 2006. Jim was invited to the Minnesota Vikings mini-camp in 2007 as an undrafted free agent. He served as the quarterback and defensive backs coach at East Stroudsburg-South H.S. under Hall of Fame Head Coach Ed Christian from 2007-2009, while coaching two record-breaking quarterbacks at ES-South, Zach Frederick (2007) and Rob Moyer (2008). Jim currently serves as the Head Football Coach at Pleasant Valley High School, leading the Bears to the 2010 Mountain Valley Conference Championship, and PV's first district football playoff berth, while being named the 2010 Pocono Record "Coach of the Year."
