During his senior year as a Cavalier, Ray served as Captain of the football and wrestling teams, while also being named Most Valuable Player of the baseball team. He also earned selection as a "Scholar Athlete," as well as being voted "Most Athletic" and "Most Spirited," while serving all four years as the President of the Class of 1965. Upon graduation from ESHS, Ray enlisted in the United States Navy, and, after serving for four years, he enrolled at East Stroudsburg State College. Ray graduated from ESSC in 1975, lettering in baseball for the Warriors. He served as an employee of the United States Postal Service for 31 years, retiring in 2005. Ray has served

He was also named to the All-Mountain Valley Conference team as both a junior and a senior, also earning First-Team All-Area recognition as a senior, while rushing for 1,042 yards and being selected to participate in the McDonalds-Lehigh Valley Football Classic All-Star Game. At North, Chris was also a member of the National Honor

Society, while being honored with being selected to receive both the "Board of Governor's" and the "Gifted Minority" Scholarships to Shippensburg University. While at Shippensburg, Chris played 3 years of football and 2 years of lacrosse, while earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Marketing, with a minor in Coaching. During his Cavalier athletic career, he earned 8 varsity letters, 4-each in both cross country and wrestling, while serving as team Captain for both sports during his senior year. In wrestling, Dan compiled a record of 77-wins, 17-losses, finishing first or second in the Centennial League tournament during all four years. As a junior, he finished second in both District XI and PIAA regional competition, then as a senior, earned league, district and championships, while finishing fourth in the PIAA State Tournament. As a senior, Dan also served as President of the ESHS student council, while academically ranking #4 in his class. Upon graduation from ESHS, Dan attended the United States Naval Academy, where he wrestled during his first three years and earned a

varsity letter as part of the team ranked in the top ten nationally. During his senior year, he also competed in judo, winning the Eastern Championships and placing third at Nationals, while earning All American honors. Dan earned a BS degree in Oceanography from the U.S. Naval Academy, then served six years active duty in the submarine service and 15 years in the Naval Special Warfare community as a reservist, retiring as a Commander in 2007. He also earned a MS degree in Engineering Management in 1997. The 1994 East Stroudsburg Cavalier Boys' Basketball Team won both the Centennial League and District XI AAAA Championships—the first "big school" District XI Championship basketball team in Monroe County history. The Cavs then advanced to the "Elite 8" in the P.I.A.A. State Basketball Tournament, defeating both Reading and Coatesville, losing a close, hard-fought battle to the eventual State Champion Chester, finishing their dream-season with a record of 27-wins and 3-losses.

The East Stroudsburg Area School District Athletic Hall of Fame was created in 2002 to honor those who have brought honor and prestige to our school district and our athletic program. Past
