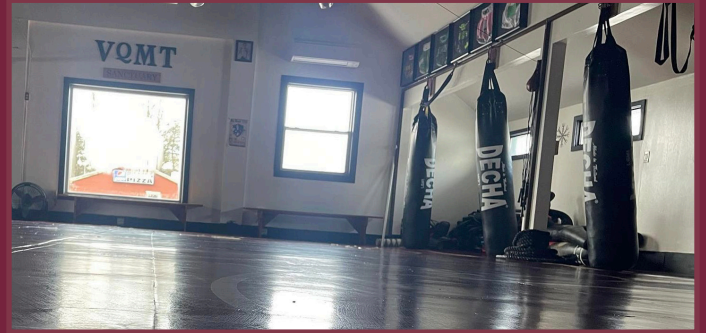
JAPANESE CULTURE CLUB

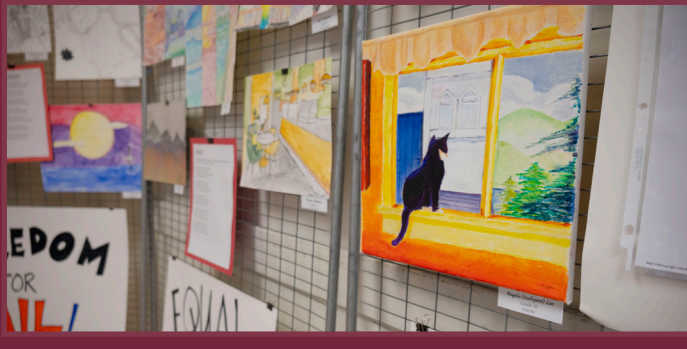
GENDER & SEXUALITY ALLIANCE

This organization is not open to all students, but exemplary students are chosen by a committee of faculty members. Students must have a cumulative GPA of 85 or better and also must attend MCI for two semesters to be considered. MCI reviews new candidates each September, and students are inducted into MCI's NHS chapter every October.
