Fargo Public Schools is hosting about 30 local mental-health providers to meet with its schoolbased mental-health professionals at the Community Resource Fair from 10-11:30 a.m. on Thursday at North High School.

The District's counselors, social workers, school psychologists and other mental-health professionals will visit with the outside mental-health providers about the services they provide in the community. They will work with these organizations to connect students and families to community resources to reduce barriers and improve access to education. This event helps create awareness for FPS mental-health professionals of what resources are available in the community.

Visiting organizations include Fargo Cass Public Health, Great Plains Food Bank, Hospice, Prairie St. John's, Youthworks, The Salvation Army, Southeast Human Service Center, North Dakota Autism Center, and many more. From these representatives, District mental-health professionals will learn about available resources related to mental health, food instability, housing insecurity, grief support, chemical health, substance abuse, and more.

Each community provider has submitted a short video briefly explaining their missions, services, and target population. FPS staff will view this video before attending the Community Resource Fair, which will help them be prepared for specific conversations they would like to have with the providers in attendance.
