Ed Clapp Elementary School's students and families will learn how to collect and analyze clues to help solve crimes at Forensic Science Night from 5:30-7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 7.

South High School science teacher Brittany Olson, who teaches a forensic science class at the high school, will lead the elementary schoolers through the basics of crime scene investigation.

The elementary schoolers will get a hands-on lesson in the tricks of the investigative trade and learn some of the real-life tools that detectives use to solve cases. Olson will teach them how to collect evidence, analyze fingerprints, compare blood types, dust for fingerprints, analyze hair under a microscope, make dental impressions, collect shoeprints, and use luminol.

If the investigators uncover a clue that they might be hungry, pizza will be served for the students and their families.

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
