

FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS ANNOUNCES ADMINISTRATION ASSIGNMENTS

Fargo Public Schools announces four administrative assignments within the District.



Rachel Kenowski has been named assistant principal for Washington Elementary School, a new position for the school. She will assume the position on July 1.

Kenowski joined Fargo Public Schools in 2008, initially serving as a first grade teacher at Jefferson Elementary School. From 2016-21, she served as a title math teacher and math recovery interventionist at Jefferson. In 2021, she became the ESSER Coach at Washington Elementary School. She began her educational career at Barnum Elementary School in 2006 as a second grade teacher.

Kenowski holds a Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education with a mathematics focus from Concordia College and a Master of Arts in Curriculum and Instruction from St. Catherine University in St. Paul.



Danielle Lapos has been named assistant principal for Lewis and Clark Elementary School. She assumes the position on July 1 from James Moe, who is leaving Fargo Public Schools to take an administrative position in a different district.

Lapos joined Fargo Public Schools in July 2019 as a special education area service coordinator. Prior to joining FPS, Lapos served as a special education teacher at L.E. Berger Elementary in West Fargo Public Schools. From 2012-15, Lapos was a residential coordinator/teacher at the New England Center for Children in Southborough, Mass. Before transitioning into her educational career, Lapos served as a senior caregiver at Annandale Health and Community Services in

Annandale, Minn. from 2008-12. During this time, she provided care to senior citizens with dementia.
