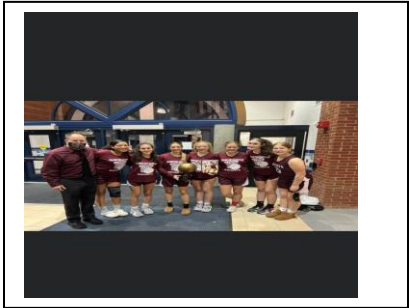


STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT
