Dear RCSD Community,

When I first came to the RCSD, the student club program looked a little different. At the High School, there was always a very robust club program. The school received anywhere from 15-37 student requests for new clubs every year! That seems like a lot, but when we took a closer look at the kinds of clubs available, we found there wasn't a club for every student who wanted to join one.

There were clubs focused on skill-building, the arts, community acceptance, and academics, but there were clearly a number of underrepresented populations. For example, the engineering course pathway was an important addition at RHS, but there were no clubs having



anything to do with engineering! As a result, the school launched an Aerospace Club in the fall of 2022. Other clubs that formed at the same time include the Bridges Club (which works to connect students), a Craft Club, Film Club, The Billion Oyster Project Club, and the Sports Medicine Club. They are all still going strong today.


A similar evaluation at RMS at the same time found that clubs were often offered based on recommendations from club advisors, rather than students. The school decided to survey students for feedback on what kinds of clubs they would like to see. Students told us they'd like to compete in something other than sports. We also learned there were a lot of kids who were interested in coding and Legos, all of which combined to lead to the creation of a FIRST® LEGO® League Robotics team called appropriately, "Ryebotics." Today at RMS, students lead the clubs, and while faculty advisors are there to assist, they don't drive them.

In the years since its creation, the RMS Ryebotics team has gone from strength to strength. This school year, in three short months, the 10-student team designed, built, and coded a robot to compete in the FIRST® Lego League® Challenge, an international competition that asks students ages 9-16 to build and program a LEGO® robot that navigates the missions of a robot game. In the qualifying tournament, they placed 5th overall out of 14 teams with a high robot mission score of 215, far exceeding their goal score of 200. The win secured them a spot at the Championship Tournament at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) in Troy, NY, on February 10.

At the tournament, the team competed against 24 other teams from around the state, taking home a trophy for "First Place - Innovation Project" in the Hudson Valley FIRST® LEGO® League as selected by a panel of judges.

Congratulations to the team and to coach and RMS engineering teacher Susan Granata. Build on! And to all the new RMS and RHS students out there who are looking for a different kind of club, join in! We've got you covered.
