AP/CHS COURSES - Important New Info

If you are planning to register for any AP and/or CHS (College-in-High-School) classes next year, please note the following recommendations regarding the number of classes for each grade level:

9th Grade: 1 courses

• 10th Grade: 2 courses

• 11th Grade: 3 courses

• 12th Grade: 4 courses



If you register for more than the recommended number of courses, you MUST SIGN the agreement at the end of the your registration packet indicating you understand that it's more than the recommended number of AP/CHS courses AND that you understand you will NOT be able to drop the course(s) during the school year.

Automatic Advancement

A state law says that students who meet or exceed standard on statewide English, Mathematics or Science assessments or who successfully complete an advanced course must be **automatically enrolled** in the next most rigorous course.

BUT

Your family can OPT OUT using the "Opt Out" form included in your registration packet and then you could take <u>non-AP classes.</u>

Registration Process

- 1. Fill out Course Registration Form (CRF)
- 2. Get CRF Signed by Parent/Guardian
- 3. Input Courses into **StudentVue** (7 Credits/14 Lines!*)

- 4. Meet with Counselor to Lock In


Notes: High School level math courses require students to use a scientific calculator such as TI-83/TI-84. It is recommended

that students purchase their own personal calculator, however the school will provide a calculator as needed.

Students will build upon algebraic skills from Algebra 1 by applying them to new geometric concepts. Students will formalize their reasoning skills to write proofs built on definitions, axioms, and theorems. Students will study symbolic logic, parallel and perpendicular lines, triangle properties, quadrilateral properties, and properties of other polygons and circles. Other topics that will be studied are similar and congruent figures, right triangle trigonometry, coordinate geometry, geometric transformations, area, surface area and volume of three-dimensional figures.

SCHEDULE CHANGE POLICY



It is critical for families to understand that the choices made by students during registration are considered to be final. Courses that are offered and staffing for the following year are based on the choices students make during the registration process.

Schedule changes may be made on a limited basis for the following reasons within the first 10 days of school:

- A graduation requirement must be added
- ☐ Administrative withdrawal is requested
- ☐ Incomplete schedule
- ☐ Duplicate classes/obvious errors
- ☐ IEP/ELL placement issues

In keeping with District practices, classes may be dropped only during the first 10 days of the semester and only for very specific reasons listed above. Courses dropped during this 10 day window are not listed on the transcript and the student is transferred to another class.

Courses cannot be dropped after the 10th day - except in extreme circumstances and only with Principal approval.



Year-long classes will not be dropped at any time during the year unless there are exceptional extenuating circumstances approved by the principal. Full-year classes are exactly that: Full Year.

You can avoid any issues with dropping classes by choosing your classes very, very carefully at registration time and remember - if you choose a class and you get that class, you will be keeping that class no matter what.



Due to capacity limitations, schedule changes will not be possible after classes are locked in.

Think very carefully about your classes and pick wisely. **Add MANY Alternates.**
