






KINDERGARTEN ENROLLMENT IS NOW OPEN FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR!








Family Literacy Night K-2

tickets for a chance to "pie a teacher". Staff participated in a spirit day and played in the charity volleyball tournament.




