What Is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal educational program, founded in 1965 as the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, reauthorized in 2002 as part of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), Amended as the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA).

Its purpose is to make sure that all children can have a high-quality education.

Title I provides extra help to the students who need it the most. These are the children who are the furthest from meeting the standards the state has put in place for all children.

The program serves millions of children in elementary, middle and high schools every year. Most school districts participate. About half of NC schools (in all 115 school districts) receive Title I funds. Title I also serves children who attend parochial and private schools.



How Title I Works

Funds are provided to schools based on the number of students qualifying for free/reduced price lunch.

In Title I schools, teachers, administrators, other school staff, and parents work to:

- ~identify students most in need of educational help
- ~set goals for improvement
- ~measure student progress
- ~develop programs that add to regular classroom instruction
- ~involve parents in all aspects of the program

Additional teachers and teacher assistants

Additional training for school staff

Extra time for instruction

A variety of teaching methods and materials

JCE's Title I program is revised each year by administrators, teachers, and parents.

Title I Teachers & Tutors at JCE

Title I teachers and tutors at JCE provide additional support to students in grades 1st – 5th in both reading and math. Students are instructed in either a small group pull-out setting, or the teacher/tutor helps the student in their classroom. Title I teachers and tutors support the regular classroom teacher with instruction and plan lessons according to the Onslow County Prior Standards and the NC Standard Course of Study. Students receive Title I support 3-4 times a week, depending on their specific needs and attendance.
