Rare Cars Found at Abandoned Warehouse

Luxury car fanatics are raging over a recent discovery of 22 rare cars found abandoned in a warehouse in Belgium. Of these 22 cars were 16 Ferraris and 6 Porsches.

The owner of the warehouse in Brussels found the 22-high end vehicles and contacted Oldtimerfam, a car collection organization, to have the cars evaluated. "It was a load of highly rare Ferraris and Porsches," classic car specialist Xavier Molenaar told Jam Press.

All of the cars were wrapped in car covers and appeared to be in fantastic shape. Among the find were a large number of Ferrari Testarossas. Testarossas were produced between 1984 and 1996, with used models selling for around \$180,000.

Some of the Porsche 911 came in different models and colors. Some Turbo and "S" models, which online can sell up to \$250,000.

Most of the vehicles in the warehouse were very rare finds. The most rare being the Ferrari 365 GT4 BB, which were made in the 70s. This same car was sold for \$276,000 back in 2022.

Another one of the more rare finds was the Ferrari 550 Maranello. Inside the warehouse there was also a Ferrari F512 in yellow. It has been rumored that there have only been 10 ever made in that model and color.

Marine Helicopter Vanished?

Man Passes Away from Skydiving Incident

On January 31, a 73 year old man passed away tragically while skydiving. The tragedy happened in Eloy, Arizona at around 12:04PM when Gardner and his friends were planning their third jump of the day. As Gardner and his friends prepared to jump, everything was going smoothly. All of Gardner's friends made it down safely, but Gardner's parachute ended up never fully opening. He was then rushed to the hospital, and despite their efforts to save his life, he passed away. Authorities are currently looking into what happened with the parachute and working to review safety regulations. Gardner's death is the second reported deadly incident in the last month involving skydives in Eloy, Arizona. Officials are beginning to notice these incidents and are looking to put a stop to them so that everyone is safe.



Maryland's New Gun Carry Bill



Delegate Terri Hill, D-Howard County, had introduced a bill that states that unless a person had obtained a liability insurance policy of at least \$300,000, they would be prohibited from carrying their firearm anywhere within the state.

The Maryland legislation had stated, "A person may not wear or carry firearm unless the person has obtained it and is covered by liability insurance issued by an insurer authorized to do business in the State under the Insurance Article to cover claims for property damage, bodily injury, or death arising from an accident resulting from the persons use or storage of a firearm or up to \$300,000 for damaging arising from the same incident, in addition to interest and costs." It has also been stated that this liability insurance does not apply to members of the military or federal law enforcement, and there is also an exemption if an individual is carrying an unloaded gun.

Delegate Terri Hill had said that this bill is an attempt to pass "common sense" gun control, which came after talking to a constituent that said gun owners should "bear some liability in cases where there is damage because of guns being used in ways that cause harm," the constituent stated out of concern.

Frank Duffy, a gun advocate, had noted to the outlet, "It's another effort by the state to throw an obstacle in front of people trying to get their concealed carry permits. The Supreme Court made a decision that said Maryland and other states could not require a good or substantial reason to get a permit," he stated, claiming that the legislation is just another effort to hinder people from carrying their firearms while out in the public.

Microsoft's Strategic AI Partnership

The Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) is investigating an antitrust probe into Microsoft's partnership with OpenAI. The collaboration consisted of Microsoft investing \$10 billion for a 49% stake in OpenAI. This has drawn the attention of regulators on the CMA.

According to the CMA, "[We] will collect feedback on the Microsoft-OpenAI collaboration from the two companies and interested third parties. Officials will use the collected information to determine whether to launch a formal antitrust investigation." If the collaboration resulted in an antitrust probe, the CMA will evaluate whether it could negatively impact market competition. An antitrust probe is conducted when a firm, Microsoft, has excessive market power.

This is a significant review as it comes after Microsoft's \$68.7 billion acquisition of Activision Blizzard. Earlier this year, the acquisition underwent significant changes to receive approval in the U.K. A CMA regulator reported that "The CMA will review whether the partnership has resulted in an acquisition of control – that is, where it results in one party having material influence, de facto control or more than 50% of the voting rights over another entity – or change in the nature of control by one entity over another."

If the collaboration is found to violate antitrust rules, it could have negative implications for the future of the AI market.



Climate Crisis in Chile

Many developing nations around the world, such as Chile, are suffering the catastrophic consequences of climate through a rapidly degrading environmental status. Chile is used to severe climaterelated emergencies, but a new beast has emerged to terrorize the Latin American country: Wildfires.


Chile is a country situated along the western seaboard of South America and for years has worked to adapt to the regular threat of Tsunami's, learning the importance of developing evacuation plans and moving hospitals and other critical buildings away from the coast, with stringent construction codes reflecting the threat of earthquakes.

Flames tore through a Chilean town in 2017, killing 11 people in its path, and was at the time believed to be a "special and unique situation," according to Francisco de la Barrera, a researcher at the University of Concepión. However, in 2023, wildfires burned more than a million acres and killed two dozen people.

Chile now faces one of the globe's deadliest wildfires in more than a century, with casualties still soaring to at least 112 dead and 300 missing. The fires ripped through isolated mountain communities into densely populated areas in the Valparaíso region of central Chile, northwest of the capital, Santiago. Since then, Chile has declared a red-alert state of emergency regarding the raging wildfires. Allied countries have extended their arms to Chile, offering support during this crisis through foreign aid.

President Joseph Biden of the United States has released a statement on the Wildfires in Chile, expressing his feelings on the matter, saying, "Jill and I are deeply saddened by the loss of life and devastation caused by the ongoing wildfires...my administration is in contact with our Chilean partners, and the United States is ready to provide necessary assistance to the Chilean people..." showing his support for the country in their state of emergency.





Democracy in Peril: The Russian '24 Election

Nevermore has the voice of the tired, cold masses mattered more than what is presented before us. Onlookers from across the globe now bear-witness to the fraudulent, tyrannical swindling of the people's choice. Wholly personified by their one-bid candidate to save Russia; "There are no free and fair elections in Russia."

Since the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, Russia - or more formally the Russian Federation - has conducted national elections to decide the next leadership of its vast reaches. From 1991 to 1996, a presidential cycle lasted five years. This was then brought down to four years from 1996 to 2012. From 2012 onward, term limits have remained locked at six years.

The year 2012 marked a change in Russian politics. From 2008 to 2012, Dimitriy Medvedev held the position of president and swore Putin back into his old position of Prime Minister. This would, according to Russian law, permit Putin to run for a third term as it was not consecutive. Medvedev was a puppet of Putin and his political faction. During the March 2012 Elections, Putin was sworn in for his third term - which had now been extended to six years. In 2021, Putin passed a bill nullifying all of his previous terms, officially giving him the ability to legally run (and rule) until 2036.

This would exemplify the autocracy that Putin has successfully raised. All other Russian opposition parties - which, during the 90s, were considered legitimate political adversaries - had become nothing more than puppet-factions loyal to Putin's policies and leadership. As the years dragged on, the All-Russian Political Party "United Russia" - or the political alliance Putin belongs to - began to sink its claws deeper into the Russian heartland. Opposition was met with near instantaneous repression, even on a local level. In 2018, Alexei Navalny - a prominent Russian Nationalist and firm Anti-Putin politician - was barred from participating in that year's election. Shortly thereafter, he'd be arrested, and has been under Russian police custody since 2021.

The latest Russia has seen in terms of genuine political opposition was in October and November of 2023. In October, a rural Russian politician named Yekaterina Dontsova announced her bid for the 2024 Election; however, Dontsova would be barred from participating within days of her announcement. Then, a less-than-new face peered its way into the Russian political scene. Boris Nadezhdin, long-time member of the Russian Duma (*Council*) and career politician announced his bid for the 2024 election with the backing of Dontsova. While Duntsova operated on a firmly Liberal platform, Nadezhdin made his campaign palatable for the average Russian. Nadezhdin foretold of his plan to end the war in Ukraine, however never used language that seemed inherently degrading to the Russian national spirit.

Yet, Nadezhdins run would be cut-short. On Thursday, February 8th, 2024, Nadezhdin would be barred from continuing his campaign. Despite an appeal, the Russian Electoral Commission denied his pleas, officially taking Nadezhdin off the ballot. In response, Nadezhdin reportedly stated, "There are no Free and Fair elections in Russia."

Deadly Drone Hits Syrian Base Housing US Troops

On February 5th, 2024, a drone attack was launched late Sunday evening that struck a military base in Eastern Syria, where U.S. troops were stationed, causing at least six allied Kurdish soldiers dead.

It attacked the training ground at al-Omar base of Deir el-Zour, where the deadly drone hit an area where the forces commando units were being trained. No U.S. troops were killed or injured due to this attack. This was the first attack in Syria or Iraq since the U.S. had launched strikes over the weekend against Iran-backed militias. Militia fighters have been carrying out assaults on U.S. forces and civilian targets in the region since the breakout of the Israel-Hamas war in October.

The Syrian Democratic Forces first thought and blamed "Syrian regime-backed mercenaries" for the attack on Sunday, but after further investigating the attack they now accused "Iran-backed militias." The Islamic Resistance claimed responsibility for the attacks on Sunday and even released a video of them launching the drone that had been used in the attack.

Due to this, the U.S. military carried out strikes against Houthi militant targets in Yemen over the weekend, also striking four anti-ship cruise missiles, which they determined "presented an imminent threat to the U.S. Navy ships and merchant vessels," in the Red Sea. In response, Houthi rebels vowed "escalation" with a spokesman vowing to continue its own attacks, and predicted a wider war would end the U.S. presence in the region. "If the regional war breaks out, it equals the end of US hegemony in the region," he stated. The islamic Resistance struck dozens of attacks using drones against U.S. military bases in Iraq and Syria, repeatedly calling for American forces to withdraw from the region.

Kenyan Cult Leader Charged with Over 191 Deaths

A Kenyan cult leader, Paul Nthenge Mackenzie, a religious cult leader, has been charged with 191 deaths of children, along with 29 others, according to the Malindi High Court. Mackenzie ordered his followers to starve themselves and their children to death so that they could go to heaven before the world ended.

A total of 429 bodies that were found were starved to death, but most of the children were strangled, beaten, or suffocated to death by this cult. These bodies were found buried in the Shakahola forest in mass graves.

Mackenzie and the 29 others pleaded not guilty to the charges. One suspect was found mentally unfit to stand trial.

Mackenzie was the founder and leader of what he called the Good News International Ministry. He preached to the followers that the world was ending. Followers have told their families and officials that they believed Mackenzie when he preached that starvation was the path to salvation.

He allegedly split members into smaller groups assigned by biblical names. These smaller groups are believed to have died together and been buried together in mass graves.

He was a taxi driver before he started this cult in the early 2000s. He quickly gained followers from his church and from being online.

Surviving members of the group have told family members that what he preached would often come true. One of his predictions was that "a great virus" would come, just before COVID-19 hit the country.

When his cult started to grow, authorities became more and more suspicious. They ultimately arrested him in 2018 for being critical of the government, but they never prosecuted him.

Psychologists say it will take awhile to deprogram the surviving members of this cult, as they still believe what he preached. Mackenzie and his other associates have been held in custody since last April and are pleading not guilty.

Shaking the Planet: Are the Himalayas in Danger?

Tibet, the heart of Asia, could be torn in half over time as pieces of the Himalayas' plates peel off underneath despite its growing size.

A team of scientists in China and the U.S. studied the underground seismic waves from earthquakes in and around Tibet. Two massive tectonic plates have formed them. Not only did these plates create the Himalayas, but they may also be slowly destroying them as they violently crash into each other.

The Indian and Eurasian plates, two continental tectonic plates, have collided beneath the colossal mountain range. When this happens, the denser continental plate slides under the lighter plate, which is called subduction. This process, however, makes it challenging to predict what could be happening in Tibet. Others suggested that the bulk of the Indian dish could be sliding under the Eurasian plate, though not fully diving into the mantle in a process called underplating.

Experts suggest that the plates could undergo both processes simultaneously and even found evidence of the Indian dish subducting while warping and tearing deep within the Earth's crust. This process alone could be the source of recent earthquakes and even tear the Indian plate in two.

New research points to an increased risk of earthquakes along the plate boundary, yet it remains a mystery to researchers how what goes beneath the surface affects what we see above it.

He has won several awards for his contributions to music, but in addition to his music career, Keith also ventured into acting and entrepreneurship, owning a restaurant chain called "I Love This Bar & Grill," inspired by one of his hit songs.

Toby Keith had accomplished several amazing things over his lifetime, as he was a former rodeo hand, oil rigger, and semi pro football player who became the king of country music, singing his anthems to millions of fans across the globe. It is safe to say that Toby Keith will be remembered and cherished for lifetimes to come, memorialized through his music and in the hearts of fans everywhere.



Jim Harbaugh is the New Chargers Head Coach

On January 24, 2024, the Los Angeles Chargers agreed to terms with former Michigan head coach Jim Harbaugh as head coach. As a former quarterback for the Chargers, Harbaugh spent nine years as the head coach for the University of Michigan where he led the organization to three consecutive Big Ten Championships.

His most recent accomplishment being his 15-0 season, crowning the Wolverines as the 2023 National Champions.
