Spotlight: Our HMS Music Teachers

Our three talented music teachers: Mr. Barkon, Mr. Gunn & Mr. O'Herron spoke with our Dragon's Post staff writers Gia Damico & Giuliana Oddo about the experience.

Delivering


On Valentine's Day, NJHS spent the first block going around the school and delivering everyone's bear. Everyone really enjoyed this, and it made many people's day!

Chloe - Movie




Movie Title: Be My Valentine Charlie Brown

Song title: "Enchanted" Artist: Taylor Swift




