Students can <u>apply now</u> to enter this year's Next Great Idea competition.



This contest gives students a chance to share their ideas for solving a problem and win prize money.

The Next Great Idea is a part of the district's Research and Development Forum (R&D Forum), a district-wide celebration of student innovation and achievement.

How to apply:

Application information can be found on the <u>SMSD's R&D Forum webpage</u>. **The deadline to apply for the pitch competition has been extended to Friday, March 8, 2024.** Optional practice sessions with industry mentors will be available for students who apply to compete.

About the contest and Prize \$\$\$

Applicants chosen as finalists will pitch their Next Great Idea to a panel of judges during the morning of April 27, 2024, at the Center for Academic Achievement, 8200 W. 71st Street. The pitch competition will be live-streamed so friends and family can watch and vote as well. The top three awards are \$2,500, of which \$1,000 is a cash award to be used by the winner to pursue their passion and education, and up to \$1,500 will be awarded as a "build it" grant to support making the winner's pitch a reality. A People's Choice category, determined by public voters, will be awarded a \$500 prize. There will also be an Idea of Promise award with a prize of \$500.

Students, families, and staff members are encouraged to enter student-created projects, experiments, or art projects to share in this district-wide event. 




- Day 0: the 1st day of symptoms or test positive day

LOSS OF INTEREST

They lose interest in activities they used to enjoy.



EXCUSES & APOLOGIES

They find themselves making excuses or apologizing for their partner's inappropriate behavior.



PHYSICAL SIGNS

Unexplained bruises or injuries start appearing, raising concern.



EMOTIONAL CHANGES

You notice a sudden change in their demeanor or self-confidence, particularly when they're around their dating partner.



Steps You Can Take:



Show your support and express your concern. Accept what your teen tells you and avoid being judgemental or offering ultimatums, like forcing them to break up.





Inform yourself about teen dating violence before offering advice. When you move forward, make sure your teen feels supported and empowered.






Parking Permits

ICT Updates

We want to remind you of a few things now that we are back in the swing of the school year:

- 1. Your MacBook must have the district issued case on it at all times. (Failure to have the cover in place will result in confiscation of the MacBook.)
- 2. Please only carry your MacBook with the screen shut and with both hands to keep the machine secure.
- 3. Do not ever pick up the MacBook by the screen. The LCD is very sensitive and the pressure of your grip will break the screen.
- 4. Keyboard covers should not be used since non-Apple keyboard covers might be too large and can put pressure on the screens and cause damage.
- 5. Please don't leave your MacBook in a car overnight.
- 6. Needed programs can be found on Manager. You will not be able to download programs from the App Store for use on these devices.
- 7. Downloading VPNs (Virtual Private Networks) or other programs that mask your device on the network are a violation of the Responsible Use Policy you have agreed to. Use of these will result in the confiscation of the MacBook and you may MacBook access for the semester/school year for consistent violations.
- 8. Due to the MacBook refresh this summer and the cost of the new hardware, the replacement device cost has gone up. Although, the charger cost has dropped. The incident fees have stayed the same (fees reset in high school).
 - 1. 1st Incident/Damaged Device fee: \$100.00
 - 2. 2nd Incident/Damaged Device fee: \$150.00
 - 3. 3rd and Subsequent Incident/Damage Device fee: Actual cost of repair/replacement or \$300.00 whichever is greater.
 - 4. Apple MacBook Air M1 USB-C Cable Replacement \$19
 - 5. Apple MacBook Air M1 Charger Replacement \$39
 - 6. Apple MacBook Air M1 Adapter Set Replacement \$58

- 7. Apple MacBook Air M1 Replacement/Lost Device fee \$1,117.95

<u>ONLY SENIORS are allowed to leave campus for lunch</u> - WITH Parent Permission. More information about this privilege will be communicated to seniors soon, but will not begin until potentially after Labor Day.

2023-24 - Child Nutrition Program Meal Benefit Application

Families are encouraged to complete an application for meal benefits – free or reduced priced meals – as part of the Online Verification. The link to the Child Nutrition Program Meal Benefit Application is available on Skyward or the online application is on <u>School Cafe</u>. Families do need to create a School Cafe account if they do not already have one - more information may be located on the <u>SMSD Food Service Free and Reduced</u> web page. Contact the Food Service office by calling 913-993-9710 for questions on the meal benefit application.

Potential Benefits of Filling out the Application

Families, whose meal benefit application is approved for meal benefits, can receive a breakfast and lunch at the free or reduced price – depending on their qualifying benefit.

Families who complete an application and qualify also generate additional state funds for our schools.

Families who qualify for child nutrition meal benefits, may receive additional benefits such as free/reduced instructional resource fees, transportation fees, and Pre-k enrollment.

Consent for Disclosure and Eligibility

Families are encouraged to complete a Consent for Disclosure form in Skyward which gives SMSD Food Service permission to share a child's eligibility status information with the programs families designate on the consent form.

Families who are receiving certain types of state assistance, a meal benefit application may not be necessary. If a family is directly certified for meal benefits due to state assistance, Food Service will email a notification of eligibility. If you receive state assistance and have not received a notification of eligibility, call the SMSD Food Service office before completing a meal program application.

Families who are directly certified are encouraged to complete a Consent for Disclosure form in Skyward which gives SMSD Food Service permission to share a child's eligibility status

information with the programs families designate on the consent form.




Transportation Update

ALL Students must be registered with DS Bus Lines in order to ride the bus.

Please note the following important information for 2023-24 busing:

- Bus registration may be found at the following link: <u>DS Bus Lines registration</u>
- 2023-24 bus fees will remain the same as the prior year.



- Any student attending their home school and living 2.5 miles or more from the school qualifies for free busing. Registration is required.
- Students who qualify for the Child Nutrition Meal Benefits free and reduced priced meals may also qualify for free transportation, and enroll to ride existing routes. When registering, please provide a copy of the Child Nutrition Meal Benefits Eligibility letter to DS Bus Lines to complete the enrollment process. SMSD families can apply for Child Nutrition Meal Benefits after July 1st on School

- Transportation changes put in effect during the 2022-23 school year will remain in effect for the 2023-24 school year. This includes limiting high school routes to students residing over 2.0 miles from their school.
- Bus routes and stop locations will be determined based on those who register for busing. A minimum number of registrations (50 paid) is required in order to offer a route.
- Annual transportation registration is required for students to receive bus service.
