

4 YEAR PUBLIC COLLEGES

NO counselor/teacher letter of recommendation needed for most colleges. Most test optional or test blind.

For most public schools, you can access the **ONLINE APPLICATION** through the college website or Common App. Please be mindful of deadlines.

Public college **Honors Programs** are a great way to get a "private college education at a public college cost". May require separate application.

Tuition difference: Public schools have lower cost per semester/quarter.

HOW DO I ACTUALLY APPLY?

Common Application

- Links to Naviance to track transcripts and letters
- "Match" Comm App to Naviance
- Common App vs Coalition? Choose Common App!

Coalition Application

 DOES NOT LINK TO NAVIANCE for tracking, choose "Direct to Institution" in Naviance for these schools

College-Specific Application UC schools

- Aka Direct to Institution
- Other schools may have their own online applications

UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON SEATTLE

Two ways to apply!

- -Common App
- -ApplyWeb



No transcripts required or letters of recommendation accepted!

Fee: \$80 Seattle; \$60 Bothell

Application timeline for Autumn 2024:

- November 15, 2023 Application deadline
- March 1-15, 2024 Admission notification period
- If admitted, final transcript will be sent from Interlake in July 2024. Admission is dependent on a strong senior year. Avoid the dreaded "senioritis!"

University of Washington Bothell

Common Application is the only way to apply! apply.commonapp.org

- -November 15th is the early action deadline
- -January 15th is the regular admission deadline

COLLEGE-SPECIFIC RESEARCH

Have general questions? CALL or EMAIL THE ADMISSIONS OFFICE

Have questions about how to pay for tuition? CALL THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE

IHS Counselors are like general practitioners. We have a little information about a lot of schools, but are not the gatekeepers of all info about every college!



APPLICATION TIPS: DOCUMENTS

ALL documents will be sent through Naviance

We do not send materials through Common application!

We do not send materials though Coalition!

We do not sent materials through SendEDU or Scribble!

Students can use any means that work to apply to colleges, but school documents like transcripts, school reports and letters of rec will be sent through Naviance by their counselor.

Common App and Naviance accounts must be matched (see later slide)

FERPA

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT



Waive your rights and sign the FERPA to allow your transcripts and letters of recommendation to be sent

REGULAR DECISION

Most colleges have a regular decision deadline—many colleges offer early options and also have a regular decision date.

January 1st is a common regular decision date for private schools. Using college websites/applications make a spreadsheet of deadlines to stay organized.

UW is Nov. 15th

UC is Nov. 30th

EARLY DECISION & EARLY ACTION

Early Decision

- Apply to one ED school
- Binding If accepted, you must enroll (legal contract)
- Difficult to compare financial aid packages and scholarships
- Increases chances of admission for strong students

Early Action

- Can apply to more than one school
- Acceptance is non-binding
- Easier to compare different financial aid and scholarship packages
- May increase chances & admission decisions are made earlier

RESTRICTIVE EARLY ACTION

Varies a bit by school. Some colleges allow for early action that is restricted to that school. It is not considered ED because they do not require a commitment to enroll. (ex: Stanford, Harvard, Yale, etc.).


ROLLING ADMISSION

Colleges with rolling admission evaluate applications as they are received versus waiting to evaluate all applications after a hard deadline.



REQUESTING OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS

- Most public and private colleges require that an official transcript be sent during the application process
- Some exceptions include the UW Seattle, Cal State school and the University of California schools
- Order transcripts through Naviance for each school
- Download and save unofficial transcripts from Student Vue (Documents tab)
- No transcript fees



LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

Counselors


Yes, we will write you a letter, and we have a process (keep in mind we each write <u>over 50 letters</u> on average)

- FERPA waiver
- Letter of Recommendation Brag Sheet on Naviance
- 3 Teacher Feedback forms
- Resume on Naviance

Teachers

- Check with teachers now!
- Each teacher has a different process
- Invite teachers through Naviance AFTER they've said yes in person
 - Do <u>NOT</u> invite teachers via Common App
- Be sure to thank the recommender for writing a letter for you!
- Do not invite more than 2 teachers to write a letter for you
- Ideally you want at least 1 letter to be from a CORE subject area

REQUESTING LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION FROM TEACHERS

- Most private schools require a teacher letter of rec.
- •Ask the teacher in person. Make sure you get a yes before inviting them online.
- Invite them to submit a letter of recommendation through Naviance on the "Apply to College" section of Naviance.

NAME A TYPE OF FINANCIAL AID

Grants: Money you are granted (given) that you don't have to pay back.

Loans: Money you borrow (usually from the federal or state government) that you do have to pay back.

Scholarships: Money you are given based on achievement (athletic, academic, extracurricular, etc.). Some scholarships may take your family financial situation into consideration; others (merit scholarships) may not.

Many students receive a combination of these things.



FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) Remember to turn in your FAFSA in December (date TBD). http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/

WASFA (Washington Application for State Financial Aid): for undocumented and select noncitizens

CSS Profile (College Board): Only some schools will require

Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) http://www.wiche.edu/

Research different types of aid available at http://studentaid.ed.gov

Mr. Valdez is a GREAT resource for aid questions! Family appointments welcome.



FAFSA & WASFA

FAFSA: opening date has changed from Oct. 1 to sometime in December. Date TBD!

WASFA: follows FAFSA's timeline.

College Deadlines: colleges create their own deadlines for financial aid; "priority deadlines" should be noted for better chance of aid

Which one should you apply to?

- ☐ FAFSA: US Citizen or Green Card holder (usually)
- WASFA: Undocumented individuals and select non-citizens

If unsure, start with the <u>WASFA website</u> and they will give you a "quiz" to figure out which option is appropriate




