

Maritime Cadets Making Waves

On Thursday, April 11, a group of ten 9th grade cadets visited the Maritime Exchange for the Delaware River & Bay. The students were educated by Director of Operations, Paul Myhre, and IT Director, Michael Fink, on the Maritime Exchange's history, role on the Delaware River & Bay, and on their program Maritime On-Line. Mr. Myhre and Mr. Fink walked the cadets through all of the modules offered by Maritime On-Line including vessel locations, schedules, and tracking of related data and documentation. They provided a review of the over 2500 vessels which have visited the river this year and the wide array of cargoes imported and exported on of the river. The cadets had an informative discussion on cyber security, focusing around how the Exchange's data is managed and the numerous efforts undertaken to protect and ensure they are operational 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The trip was completed with a tour of the Maritime Exchange's facilities. Thank you to the Maritime Exchange for hosting MACHS cadets!
