Live students completed a fun tower building activity with Miss Donovan that focused on problem solving, following directions, and working through different challenges!





Mrs. Kern's class adopted a virtual class pet through #discoverdairy. During the month of December they will learn about cows and will vote on a name for their new pet.





Virtual Halloween

The Oath of Enlistment

"I Do Solemnly Swear for Myself"
In taking this oath, I bind myself to a career of commitment and to the highest standards of conduct in the ability, with a conscience before myself and the Supreme Being to which I believe. In my relationship with every individual I shall strive to do the best for my fellow man in the promotion of justice if fairly dealt.

"I Will Support and Defend the Constitution of the United States"
The Constitution of the United States is the founding document of this nation. The original document, together with its amendments and the legal interpretations of its meaning and intent, for the betterment of the United States and the welfare of its people, is the supreme law of the land. I will support and defend this Constitution with all my heart, mind, and strength.

"Against All Enemies, Foreign and Domestic"
I will do my utmost to defend this nation and its people from all enemies, foreign and domestic, whether they be citizens of this country or alien from other lands, seeking to impose a form of government or philosophy contrary to our free and democratic principles.

"That I Will Bear True Faith and Allegiance to the Same"
In word and deed, I will continue to express my devotion and loyalty to our Constitution and government, which governs under the law. I shall be an obedient and loyal citizen and will say or do nothing which can be interpreted as expressing a lack of confidence or belief in it.

"And that I Will Obey the Orders of the President of the United States"
I recognize the President as Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces and the authority in the Constitution of the United States.

"And the Orders of the Officers Appointed Over Me"
I acknowledge that the officers appointed over me are responsible for maintaining the order and discipline necessary in a military environment.

"According to the Regulations and the Uniform Code of Military Justice"
I will observe and follow all laws, regulations, and orders, and I will accept a special sense of honor and courage to uphold military discipline and standards. The Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) is the system of criminal justice that protects my rights while in the Armed Forces.

"To Help My God"
Through my belief in the Supreme Being, I firmly believe the universe of existence will bless being and provide the assistance in carrying out this need. I understand that my country may require me in the promotion of justice if this need is fairly met.
