- You'll improve your writing skills, sharpen your problem-solving abilities, and develop time management skills, discipline, and study habits.
- Most four-year colleges in the United States and colleges in more than 60 other countries give students credit, advanced placement or both on the basis of AP Exam scores.
- By entering college with AP credits, you'll have the time to move into upper level courses, pursue a double-major or study abroad.

## JACKSON AREA COLLEGE & CAREER CONNECTION (JAC<sup>3</sup>)



The importance of post-secondary education and career training is a core belief at Jackson High. In partnership with Jackson County Intermediate School District (JCISD) and the business community, Jackson High School offers the **JAC<sup>3</sup> Early/Middle College Program**.

## JACKSON AREA CAREER CENTER



JHS students also receive technical instruction in a given career field through the partnership with the Jackson Area Career Center. Students spend half of their day at the Jackson Area Career Center gaining hands on experience in addition to earning the necessary high school credits needed for graduation. Many of the programs offer accreditation and certification upon completion.
