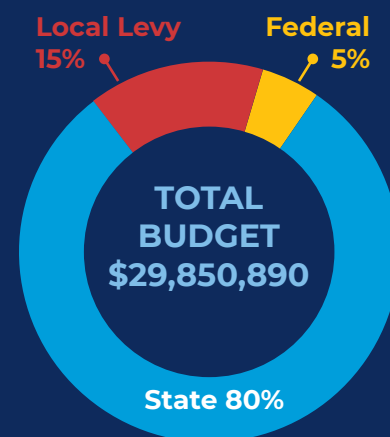

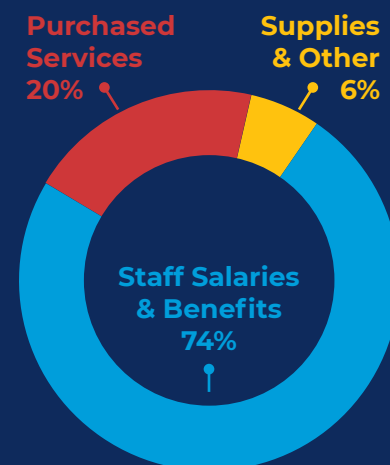

How our budget is spent:

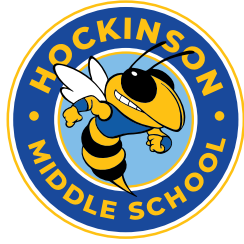

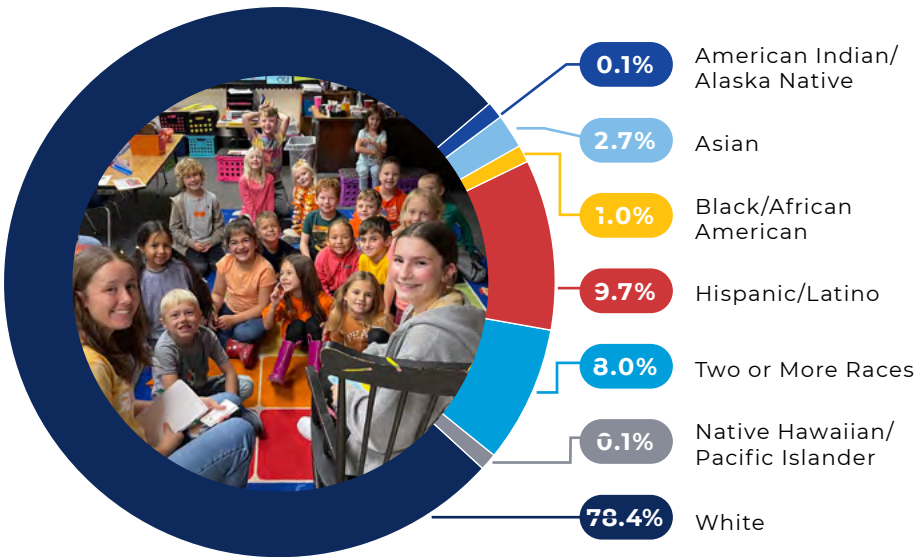

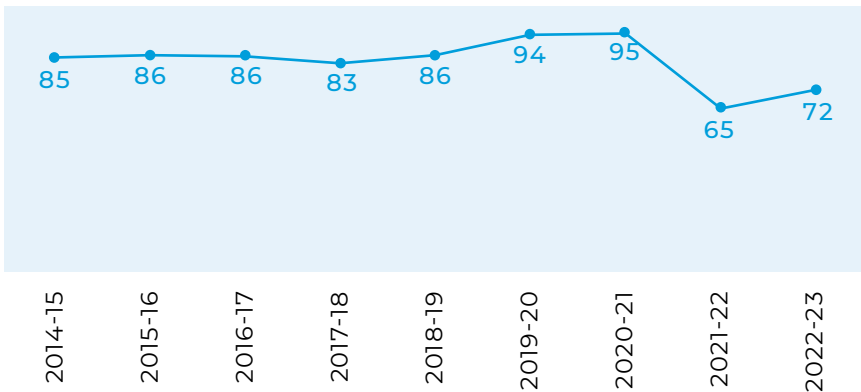

% OF STUDENTS THAT HAD FEWER THAN TWO ABSENCES PER MONTH, ON AVERAGE

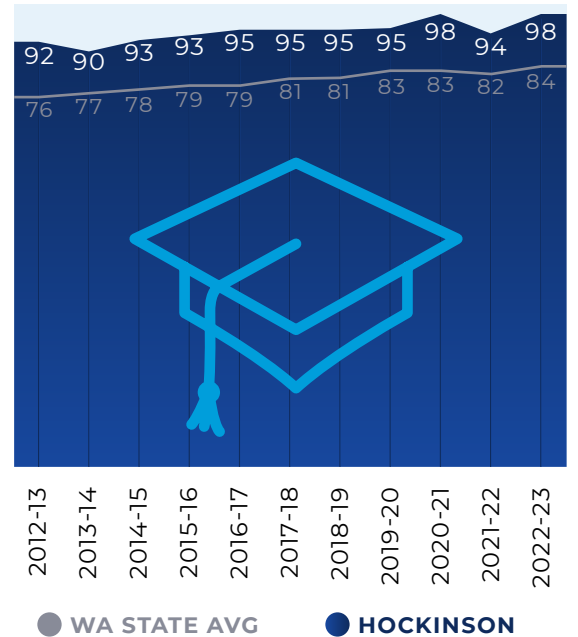

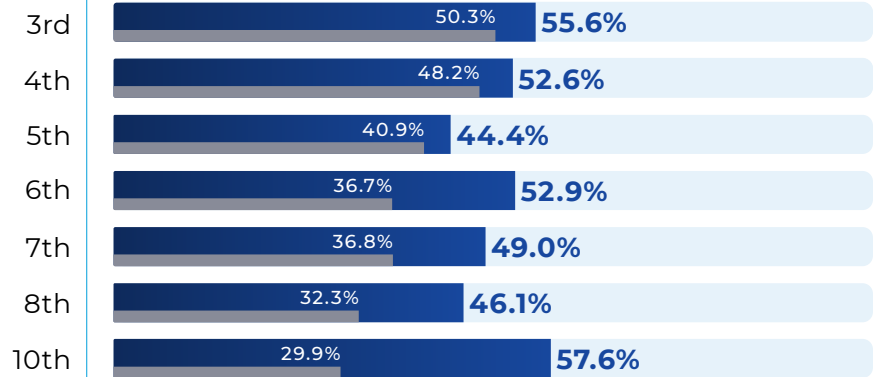

STATE ASSESSMENT RESULTS

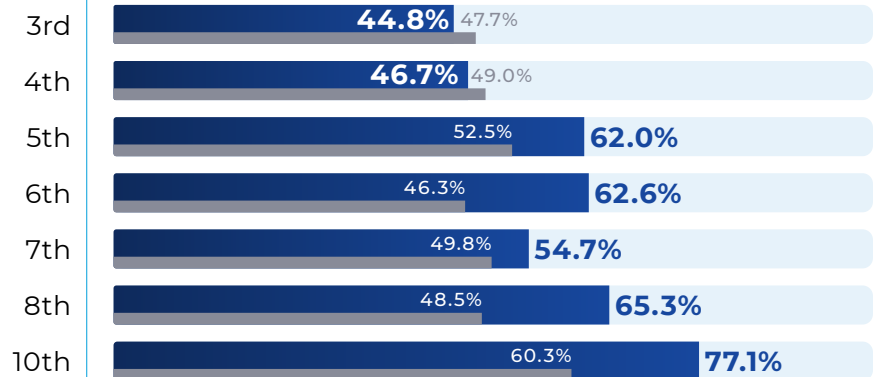
Hockinson School District students outperformed state averages in all three subjects tested in the 2022-23 school year.



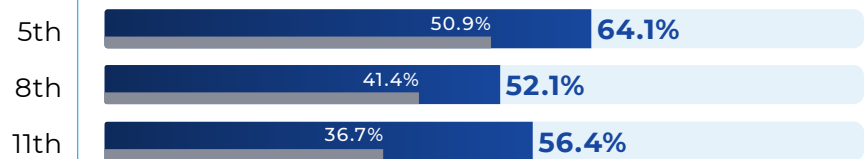
MATHEMATICS Smarter Balanced Assessment
