Logistical Concerns

- How long will each of my classes last?
- Will I get a recess?
- What if I forget my locker combination?
- What if I forget where my classes are?

Social Concerns

- Will I be able to make new friends in my classes?
- When will I get to see my friends from elementary school?
- What clubs can I join?

Academic Concerns

- Will my teachers be able to help me if I don't understand something in class?
- How much homework will we get in each class?
- Will I get reminders when assignments are do?

Addressing Logistical Concerns

- Make sure to watch the video from Taylor Road Middle School for a virtual tour of the school.
- Keep a school map at home and help your student become familiar with where their classes will be on the map.

Addressing Social Concerns

- Encourage your student to try a new club or sport to make new friends.
- Students may worry about fitting in and being liked. Encourage them to talk with their school counselor to help with this!
- Provide opportunities for your student to be independent when appropriate.
- Reassure your student that it is normal to have these worries and encourage them to ask for help from the school counselor to chat about their feelings.

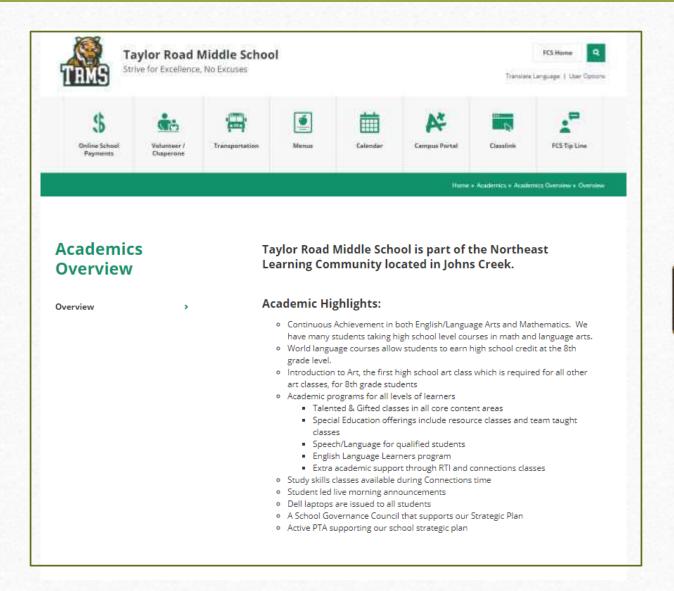






Addressing Academic Concerns

- Your student should start using a planner or an agenda to help them write down homework assignments and due dates.
- Make sure your student sets aside time for homework each day.
- Empower your student to feel comfortable talking with their teachers on their own for help.
- Help your student become familiar with the school counselor to talk about which classes they need to take and when.



What changes can I expect as my student enters Middle School?

Social & Emotional Changes

- Students may want to spend more time with their friends than with families.
- Students may want more privacy.
- Students may have more mood swings it's normal!
- Students may become more critical of themselves surrounding their appearance, their grades, and competing with their friends.

Academic Changes

- Students may struggle more to manage their time and homework due dates.
- Students may have a hard time balancing their homework and free time.
- Students may be nervous to talk with their new teachers if they need help with an assignment or project.

Developmental Changes

- Students may experience changes in height, weight, or voice changes.
- Students will begin to experience things like increased body odor and other signs of puberty and they may have questions!
- At this point, students will also begin to see increases in their logical reasoning and using concrete examples.

Reminders and Tips for Parents

- Social/Emotional:
 - Find new ways to encourage your students to tell you about their days, assignments, teachers, and friends.
 - Make sure that you show and tell your student that you care about them!
- Academics:
 - Let your students talk to their teachers themselves.
 - Allow your students to keep up with the homework assignments themselves.
 - Focus on your student's growth or progress and not always their grades. Ex: are they reading at a more advanced level? Are they completing more math problems on their own?
