In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Bear Creek Middle School receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement plan that contains information required by section 1116(b) and (c) of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The Bear Creek Middle School agrees to implement the following requirements as outlined by Section 1116:

WHAT IS TITLE I?

Bear Creek Middle School participates in Title I, Part A, Section 1116 of the *"Every Child Succeeds Act"* (ESSA), which supports state and local school efforts to challenge academic standards by reinforcing and enhancing methods to improve teaching and learning for all students. The Bear Creek Middle School (BCMS) Title I School-wide Program requires effective means of improving student achievement by including strategies to support family engagement.

JOINTLY DEVELOPED

Bear Creek Middle School will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible.

All parents were invited to our Annual Input Meeting held in the spring each school year to review and revise this plan as well as the School Wide Plan, our School Family Compact and the Parent Engagement Budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. All parent feedback received during the year is used to revise the plan for the next school year.

ANNUAL TITLE I PARENT MEETING

Bear Creek Middle School will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the School Parent Engagement Plan, the Schoolwide Plan, and the School-Family Compact.

- BCMS will hold its Annual Title I Parent Meeting in the Fall each school year prior to November 1st. All parents will be invited to attend the Annual Title I Parent Meeting via Infinite Campus, school marquee and invitation displayed in the front office and it also available on the school's website.

COMMUNICATIONS

Bear Creek Middle School will take the following actions to provide parents of participating children the following:

- Information related to the school and parent programs, meetings and other activities are sent to the parents of participating children via hand-to-hand distribution from teacher to student to send home, Infinite Campus, School website and a display within the Parent Resource Room and Counseling Suite. All information related to school and parent programs as well as other activities will be provided to parents in a format, to the extent practicable and in a language that parents can understand.
- The residential facilities for students in the Bear Creek Middle School attendance area are included in the family engagement correspondence and activities.
- Provide flexible number of meetings, such as morning and evening meetings, offer transportation as the budget permits to families with funds provided under this part, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parent and family involvement.
- Each school served under this part shall provide parents of participating children timely information about programs under this part.

- The parent and family engagement plan will be distributed to parents when they enroll their students. Bear Creek will have copies of the plan in the main office, counseling center, parent resource room, and conference rooms. Bear Creek will also post the plan on the school's website for parents to view.
- Teachers will distribute the parent and engagement plan to all students to take home to their parents.
- Information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities will be communicated in a format, to the extent practicable, and in a language that parents can understand. Methods of communication will include Infinite Campus, callout, flyers, and website announcement.

COORDINATION OF SERVICES

Bear Creek Middle School will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate Parent Engagement programs and activities such as parent resource centers that encourage and support parents in participating in the education of their children by:

- Coordinating and integrating services and programs for incoming 6th graders and outgoing 8th graders in transition meetings, and provide college and career readiness programs/workshops, school tours and parent meetings at the parents' request throughout

the school year, including how to navigate available resources (homelessness, economic aid, etc.)

- Parent support groups through onsite mental health partners.

BUILDING CAPACITY OF PARENTS

Bear Creek Middle School will build the parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:

- Providing parents with a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
- Materials and training to help parents to work with their child to improve their child's achievement, such as math and literacy training as well as using technology, including education about the harms of copyright piracy, as appropriate, to foster parent and family engagement.

 - The State and local academic assessments including alternate assessments.
 - The requirements of Title I, Part A.
 - How to monitor their child's progress.

- Bear Creek Middle School will facilitate the initiatives via a series of academic parent workshops, online resources and provide educational materials in the Parent Resource Center. Encourage parental participation in school meetings, trainings, and parent workshops that focus on state and local assessments.
