



# STAND UP FULTON FAQs FOR VOLUNTEERS

## 1. What is Stand Up Fulton?

Stand Up Fulton is a Fulton County Schools mentoring program designed to fill a gap in early intervention for high school students in need of additional support at Fulton County School's three SAFE (Student and Family Engagement) Center locations, Banneker High School, North Springs High School, and Tri-Cities High School.

## 2. Who can volunteer as a mentor?

Exempt Fulton County Schools employees assigned to the Administrative (district) office, North Learning Center and/or South Learning Center who are at least 24 years of age and able to commit to volunteering for the full school year.

## 3. What students are considered in need of additional support?

Students who:

- Are experiencing a circumstance that is negatively impacting their ability to reach or maintain their goals related to personal development or academic success.
- Have significant attendance or behavioral concerns.
- Are not receiving support through other mentorship services.

## 4. Is this a paid position?

No, this opportunity is a non-paid volunteer role.

## 5. How often does a volunteer meet with their student?

Twice a month during the student's lunch period, for a minimum of a full school year.

## 6. Where do the volunteers and students meet?

One of three FCS SAFE locations:

- Banneker High School
- North Springs High School
- Tri-Cities High School

## 7. Do I need permission from my supervisor to participate?

Yes, as part of the application process, you will need to obtain permission from your supervisor.

## 8. How are mentors and mentees paired?

Matching is completed by the Program Liaison and the SAFE Center Social Worker.

## 9. Will I need to attend training?

Yes, Stand Up Fulton's orientation typically lasts for two to three hours.



# STAND UP FULTON FAQs FOR PARENTS

## 1. What is Stand Up Fulton?

Stand Up Fulton is a Fulton County Schools mentoring program designed to fill a gap in early intervention for high school students in need of additional support at Fulton County School's three SAFE (Student and Family Engagement) Center locations, Banneker High School, North Springs High School, and Tri-Cities High School.

## 2. What students are eligible to participate?

Students in need of additional support currently enrolled at Banneker HS, North Springs HS and Tri-Cities HS.

## 3. What students are considered in need of additional support?

Students who:

- Are experiencing a circumstance that is negatively impacting their ability to reach or maintain their goals related to personal development or academic success.
- Have significant attendance or behavioral concerns.
- Are not receiving support through other mentorship services.

## 4. Will students receive incentives for their participation?

Yes, students will have the opportunity for incentives based on meeting goals and successful completion of the program.

## 5. Where do the volunteers and students meet?

One of three FCS SAFE locations:

- Banneker High School
- North Springs High School
- Tri-Cities High School

## 6. How are mentors and mentees paired?

Matching is completed by the Program Liaison and the SAFE Center Social Worker.

## 7. How does a student sign up?

Students must be referred to each SAFE Center's lead social worker by a:

- Graduation coach
- Social Worker
- Counselor
