Explore The World

Take a walk around the neighborhood or a store. Point out things you see with your child explaining what they are.

Walk And Talk

As you are exploring, ask open ended questions that start with who is, what is, when will, where does, why do and how will.



Act It Out

When provided an opportunity, act out the story. Use props like stuffed animals and use it to talk about shape, size, color and texture.

Sing It

Create or learn songs to expand your child's vocabulary. You can make up songs about daily routines. Try adding in new words.



Listening Games

Try playing games like "I Spy" and "Simon Says". This allows your child to interpret words and use their knowledge to follow directions.
