Typical Visual Arts Sequence

Students take courses based on academic performance, academic needs, graduation requirements, and previous credits earned (.5 = semester course; 1=yearlong course). Please refer to the course descriptions for specific prerequisite requirements. Students do not need to take courses in consecutive order, and once completing intro, can take any level one course whenever possible. The level 1 of any art course is the prerequisite for the following level 2 (IE Introduction to Art/VAComp1; Drawing 1; Drawing 2). Any student grade level can start an art class in one semester, so after completing Introduction to Art/ VAComp1, a student can diversify and choose any art class when available at any time 9th-12th grade. Pending availability within years, many students can choose to take multiple art courses simultaneously in one school year.

Completion of a 3-credit Visual Arts pathway gives a student eligibility for the Fine Arts Diploma Seal (when completing an additional 4th credit within arts fields of study).
