There is one Head of House for each of the 4 houses, Altruismo, Amistad, Isibindi, and Rêveur with the following leadership responsibilities:

Communicating expectations outlined by the Headmaster to staff house members.

Attend RCA House System Leadership Academy.

Guides House Leaders in setting house goals and weekly activities.

Sets and implements leadership goals for the house.

Tracks attendance of house members in point earning events.

Lead house leaders and staff in planning and executing
1 school event
1 school awareness month
2 full house events
preferable 1 per semester.

Communicating needs and concerns to Headmaster and PBIS Coach.

HOUSE STAFF

ALL OF COLLEGE PARK STAFF SERVE AS HOUSE STAFF. MEMBERS OF ONE OF THE 4 HOUSES, ALTRUISMO, AMISTAD, ISIBINDI, AND RÊVEUR.

House staff are a member of one of the 4 houses, Altruismo, Amistad, Isibindi, and Rêveur.

Serve on two committees planning and executing

- 1 school event
- 1 school awareness month
- 2 full house events.

Participate in schoolwide events including the house sorting day & championships.

Staff are essential for the House System to be effective and will help teachers achieve more than they think possible.

Guide and award points though the house system to create student engagement.

All house staff gain points through academic outcomes, physical activities, social activities, and by participating in creative competition.

HOUSE LEADERS

The House Council will either host elections or select a “House Leader” from the 5th grade class. House leaders collaborate to plan house events. The house sponsors & Lieutenants may also select a representative from other grade levels to work alongside each house leader. This encourages teachers from various grade levels to work and collaborate together to build stronger House leaders.

The leadership structure of each house chapter can change or be decided by our students, but the fact that it is decided by the students themselves is essential. Leaders are selected from the 5th grade class of students, and they pass on the torch to a rising 4th grader. House leaders are announced at the Championship Celebration at the end of each year. This gives the new student leader the entire summer to prepare for the upcoming school year.

HOUSE MEETINGS

House meetings occur each week from 7:10am-8:00am. House meetings are not like schoolwide assemblies, but rather like more intimate gatherings. Staff leaders are present to help moderate, but the meetings should be led by the students once they complete training. Meetings are where Houses maintain traditions, create cheers, plan celebrations, recognize and support House members, and more.
