Science Department: NTE \$10K For new LabQuest Data Collecting Interfaces. Docs Provided
On behalf of our science department, I am writing this letter to request funding for new LabQuest Data Collecting Interfaces. Over 5 years ago, the district purchased the 1st generation of LabQuests and they have been wonderful to use. They are used to record laboratory data, graph data, and take accurate measurements in chemistry, biology, and physics labs and used by multiple teachers.

Unfortunately, they are starting to break down. It started with the batteries going bad along with the software becoming glitchy. We have updated the software and have been replacing the batteries as needed but we are starting to get unit failure. We are currently sharing units among 4 different teachers hoping we have enough working units to continue doing our current labs. Fingers crossed!

We would love to replace all 24 original generation 1 LabQuest units with the new generation 3 LabQuests units so we can continue doing our fun labs. To be effective, we need 8 for biology, 8 for chemistry, and 8 for physics. This would service almost 700 students in our department each year. Even though we are requesting 24 new units at ~\$389 each, we would be happy with a smaller number as this is equipment we use, and we do need to replace them.
