H.A.W.K.S. TICKETS

As part of the CI3T plan, students earn tickets by following the school-wide expectations such as respecting others, being kind to others, following directions the first time, etc. Tickets are then used to purchase incentives. Tickets are also drawn randomly every other week from each classroom to recognize students for their hard work. Students will be recognized during morning announcements and in the newsletter. A postcard will be mailed home to parents.

In addition, as an immediate reinforcement, Ms. Becker will draw tickets from the classroom jar when she visits classrooms. Students whose ticket is drawn will have the opportunity to pick an incentive from her basket.

GOLDEN TICKETS

All staff can recognize a classroom of students for meeting HAWKS expectations by awarding a HAWKS golden ticket. Once a class receives ten (10) golden tickets, they will choose class-wide acknowledgement.

In addition to the classroom incentives, students can earn the opportunity to attend school-wide behavior parties. The theme based parties for the 2014-2015 school year are:

WHAT IS A CI3T PLAN?

CI3T is a school-wide program developed to encourage successful behaviors academically, personally, and socially. Each and every student participates just by virtue of being at Hillcrest. The goal of this school-wide plan is to equip students with the most beneficial academic, behavioral, and social skills that will support success at school and in life. This plan is also designed to create a more positive school environment.

The CI3T plan is a three-tiered plan, with the expectation that most of our student's needs will be met by the school-wide program. If the primary plan is not sufficient to meet some student's needs, additional levels of support are planned. We aim to foster a positive learning environment for all students at Hillcrest and support every student for academic, behavioral, and social success.
