



Freshman for a Day Program

The Freshman for a Day Program is underway at both High School North and High School South. program is run through the Guidance Department and affords 8th graders the opportunity to experience a taste of high school before they return as freshmen in the fall. Internet Safety Presentations

Special Agent Jesse Trail from the United States Secret Service is scheduled to deliver an engaging presentation to the freshman classes at Middletown High School South and Middletown High School North, shedding light on the National Childhood Smart Program. Developed in collaboration with the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC), this initiative aims to equip students with essential knowledge on computer and personal safety. Leveraging the expertise of NCMEC's child safety professionals, the program provides invaluable resources tailored specifically for students, covering a range of topics crucial for safeguarding against online threats and exploitation.

NJGPA Testing for Class of 2025

On March 11 - 14, the Junior Class will take the NJGPA (New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment). Students taking the exam will report to school at the normal start time. Special Class Programs and Vocational Students will also report at the normal start time. Students in 9, 10, and 12 grades will have a delayed start to the school day. What's New at Our Middle Schools

Middle School Elective Redesign

To better support our students at the middle school level, we have revamped our middle school elective structure. Each elective will be offered for a full semester instead of for a quarter (marking period) of the school year. The mandatory grade level courses have been eliminated and the courses reframed to capture a broader spectrum of skills and standards. This will allow our middle school students to have more choice than ever in their middle school electives (dependent on availability). Advisory has also been revamped and is now entitled Academic Opportunities. After getting feedback from our students, it was evident that some found the former Advisory block to be very beneficial while others did not find as much value in the time. Therefore, we have decided to also make the Academic Opportunities block an elective. Students would have the option to schedule this course or to take something else they are interested in. Students who receive intervention or attend Gifted and Talented (6th Grade) may be scheduled for Academic Opportunities to provide a time for these services to occur. New Parent-Teacher Conference Structure for 2024 - 2025

Thanks to the feedback of the school community, our elementary teaching staff members, and administration, there will be a new parent-teacher conference structure for the 2024-2025. As you may know after seeing next year's approved school calendar, the early release days that were in December have been eliminated from the school calendar. Conferences will now be held in January to provide parents the opportunity to see their child's first trimester report card prior to the conference. For the 2024-2025 school year, conferences will be on a staggered schedule which will be building-dependent. All elementary schools will hold night conferences on the evening of January 22. By moving to this new structure, the district has also been able to extend the K-3 conference timeframe to 20 minutes and the 4-5 conference timeframe to 15 minutes. It is our hope that these changes make our conferences a more beneficial experience for all. Please look for your school's specific conference schedule when we return in the fall.
