We do have some safety concerns that need to be addressed which involve our traffic and school entry protocols. We had a near miss accident on Westminster a couple of weeks ago and we need to ensure our kids safety while walking. To help us do that, we ask you to follow our traffic pattern and follow the safety patrol directives as given. We have too many not following either the traffic protocols or the Safety Patrol which makes our parking/drop-off area a major safety concern. Please make sure you are following our traffic protocols, crossing our crosswalk with our Safety Patrol, and are not parking in any of our drop-off/pick-up areas. We ask that when you drop your students off in the morning, please have them go to the playground area out back and *that you do not walk them to class*. If you need to drop something off for a student, please leave it with the front office and we will make sure they get it. We want to keep our building secure and need your help to do so.
